Susan Weekes

I was born and raised in Timaru but have spent most of my life in Wellington. I have 3 siblings but we did not grow up in an extended family. My grandparents died before I was born and aunts/uncles were few and far between. A turning point in my life was being able to take the opportunity to spend a year in Ohio, USA, as an AFS exchange student in 1976-77. This was something I had to earn and pay for as my parents could not afford to do that for me. My determination has carried me onwards. After that experience. I felt confident to make the decision to go to university where I met my husband of 42 years. A university education may not sound like an unusual thing to do for some but I was the first person in our family to do so and 30 years later, our eldest son became the 2nd person to go on to higher education. I still stay in touch with my American family - my US mom has just turned 92!



We have 3 adult sons, 2 of whom live locally and 1 lives in Los Angeles where we also lived on our OE in the 80's. Our son has a green card but I have recently achieved gold card status! I have chosen to continue to work fulltime as a Health, Safety & Wellbeing Coordinator for a small NGO that supports people with mental disabilities to live as independently as possible in the community. I spent many years as a fulltime mother and longtime volunteer in organisations such as Scouting NZ and WREMO etc but now spend most of my spare time in the garden or reading. I love to try new things and satisfy my natural curiosity through new experiences, traveling and meeting people.

My parents both passed away within weeks of being diagnosed with cancer. My father died 20 years ago, just days before Christmas and my mother died very suddenly on Christmas Day in 2022. It was my experience of shock/grief and the decisions I was required to make at that time that brings me here to talk to you tonight, on behalf of Death Without Debt.


