# **Oranga Tamariki**

There's no harder job, or greater reward. The people who care for children are the heart and home of the Ministry of Vulnerable Children, Oranga Tamariki. They welcome children and young people into their families and help turn young lives around. Speakers Tania Macaulay and Janet Meyer described the role of the Ministry and their need to locate more families who are willing to help young people in need of care. There are many ways that you can care for a baby, child or young person, whether you are thinking about foster care, permanent care or adoption.

In an average day at the Ministry they receive around 300 calls from people concerned about the safety of a child, support extended family and foster carers to look after around 4000 children and young people in care, hold around 60 family group conferences, be in touch with more than 100 families to make a positive difference for their children, be responsible for around 100 young people in youth justice residences.



## **In History This Week**

- 22 August 1969 ~ First 'Young Farmer of the Year' chosen at the inaugural event in Auckland. Gary Frazer from Swannanoa was the winner.
- 25 August 1920 ~ Captain Euan Dickson completed the first air crossing of Cook Strait, flying a 110-hp Le Rhone Avro from Christchurch to Upper Hutt and carrying the first air mail between the South and North Islands.
- 25 August 1948 ~ Three people were killed, 80 injured and about 150 buildings destroyed or badly damaged by NZ's deadliest recorded tornado. It cut a path 100 to 200m wide through Frankton, Hamilton.

The late Lester Paul was Donald's personal assistant during his Presidency and Donald run every meeting with precision using his memory following an update of the evenings proceedings from Lester.

Donald was awarded a Paul Harris Fellow (PHF) on 30 November 1995 and on achieving his 50 years of service was awarded a second PHF and received a sapphire pin. Donald we are all extremely proud of you.
