- 22 July 1987 ~ Lotto goes on sale for the first time with outlets experiencing long queues in the hope of winning the first prize of \$360,000.
- 25 July 1981 ~ Anti-Springbok protesters block Hamilton's rugby park forcing the abandonment of the Springboks-Waikato match.
- 26 July 1863 ~ Floods kill 25 gold miners in Central Otago at the Arrow diggings, north-east of Queenstown. It was the worst day of a brutal winter during which an estimated 100 miners were drowned, buried by mudslides or died of exposure.
