# **Fathers Day**

It all began in May 1909 when a young woman Sonora Smart Dodd sat in church listening to a Mothers Day sermon. She decided she wanted to designate a day for her Dad as her mother had died in childbirth and Sonora's dad had raised the newborn and his other five children.

The following year Sonora wanted to celebrate Fathers Day 5 June, her fathers birthday, and petitioned for the holiday to be recognised in her city. The first Fathers Day was celebrated on 19 June 1910 where young women handed out red roses to their fathers during a church service. It wasn't until 1972 that President Nixon signed the public law that made it a permanent holiday.

President Dylan said Fathers Day is about family and imparting knowledge. It appears that Dylan is looking forward to this upcoming Fathers Day where he will be spending time with his Rotary family and imparting his knowledge on brewing.



- 28 August 1954 ~ Pauline Parker 16 and friend Juliet Hulme 15 were found guilty of murdering Pauline's mother. Peter Jackson later produced a film based on the crime - Heavenly Creatures.
- 31 August 1974 ~ Leader of the Labour Party since 1965 and prime minister since late 1972, "Big Norm" died suddenly at the age of 51. Norman Kirks resting place is in the new cemetery here in Waimate.
- 2 September 1960 ~ NZ Sport enjoyed one of its greatest days in Rome,
   Peter Snell won the 800m and Murray Halberg won the 5000m.
