

Call for Nominations

Serving the Rotary Clubs of Te Wai Pounāmu/The South Island, Aotearoa/New Zealand

The constitution of District 9999 requires the election of two members of the District Board from Member Clubs each year (Constitution 7.01). Nominations for these two positions for the three year term commencing 1 July 2022 are now called for. Candidates must be nominated and seconded by two other Rotarians. They need to have been a member of a Rotary Club for a minimum of one year. Nominations must be submitted to the Secretary, D9999 Transition Management Team (TMT) no later than 5.00pm on the 25th of February 2022.

In relation to this, the TMT have issued the following indication of the skills and aptitudes that they are looking for to enable the Board to do its work well.

Skills required for D9999 Board Directors

A director should have the following skills.

- Integrity
- Courage
- Capacity to listen and question (an inquiring mind is an advantage)
- Good Judgement
- Commitment to the goals and values of Rotary International
- A commitment to expanding their knowledge
- Reliability and dependence
- Emotional agility
- Previous governance experience

It will be helpful for a director to have skills in one or more of the following areas:

- Strategic and governance leadership
- Informed decision-making
- Business acumen
- Communication
 - A Board Member will need to be able to commit to a three-year term on the D9999 Board. They will need to be good at working with other people and be committed to ensuring the medium and long-term strategic goals of the Rotary District 9999 and Rotary International are upheld and achieved and an understanding and commitment to Te Tiriti o Waitangi
