






To realise our future, Change is required

About the vote ...

- It's to proceed with a pilot project to explore, develop and test a new model for Rotary in Australia, NZ and the Pacific Islands
- Each Club has one vote. Abstention = No vote
- 2/3 of D9999 Clubs voting Yes = one positive district vote
- Exactly what the model will look like has not been finalised, and it will change as testing and development occurs
- Clubs and members will be consulted and informed throughout
- RI will finance the exploration and change process



A regional structure might include ...

- A Regional Council with supporting committees
- Area leaders for groups of 10-25 clubs
- Democracy Any Rotarian can nominate self or others for all roles

2-4 year terms for continuity





Timeline - Outline of Possible Steps

Approval to develop and pilot

Stage 1 to end 2022

Stage 2 to mid 2023

- Development phase
- Election, selection& training

 Transfer of initial District functions to Region

> Stage 3 to mid 2024

Stage 4 to mid 20<u>26</u>

- Further transfer of functions
- 2 year pilot complete

Parallel operation of Regional Model and Districts
