South Canterbury NBSP Community Update

May 2021

We're celebrating the great news that South Canterbury's Bowel Screening Programme has already reached the Ministry of Health's national participation goal of 60% 6 months after going live! Currently at 63% participation – our next step will be 70!

It's really positive to note that people are keen to screen and are wanting their kit to come in the mail. Our team's community presence across the region has fielded questions such as 'when will I get mine?', 'can I be screened now?', 'my husband's had his but where's mine?'. This eagerness has seen our participation rate climb fastso keep encouraging and talking about the benefits of screening with those around you and get those kits sent back!

We also get a lot of 'nah I'm all good, no issues down there thanks'. The purpose of the screening is to catch issues at an early stage, where there may be no symptoms or signs, and treat successfully. Screening saves lives. The little test kit is set to detect tiny traces of blood which may not mean cancer but could indicate polyps are present, so more checks may be needed to find out why.

Please note!

If you've had a colonoscopy in the last 5 years or have one due soon, please call 0800 924 432 to opt out of screening

Have you had a birthday recently and received a kit? If so, remember to post it off within the 6-month expiry timeframe. Check out the tips below for this. Are you wondering where your kit is?

Those aged 60-74 years:

-with an *even* birthdate i.e. 24th August = invited in year 1 (Oct 2020-Oct 2021) -with an odd birthdate i.e. 17th May = invited in year 2 (Oct 2021-Oct 2022) Invites will capture all those who are about to turn 60 or just prior to a 75th birthday if haven't been previously invited, regardless of birthdate.

1770 normal results returned from approx. 3400 invites 95 abnormal (positive) results Positivity rate of 5.1% 50 colonoscopies to date; approx. 90% found & removed polyps 1 cancer found at early stage and is treatable

WHAT'S HAPPENING ACROSS NZ?

16 DHB's are now offering screening, with 4 still to roll out by the end of 2021. Between 1 July 2017 and 31 March 2021, the national NBSP has seen:

- 624,300 people invited
- 352,400 returned kits

- 14,180 positive results
- 11,370 colonoscopies

Tips for a successful screen.

Be ready- think about your daily routines & regularity Read and check consent form carefully Put 1 yellow barcode on the tube Date your form the day you do the test Place tube into clear bag and seal well Place this and consent form in FREEPOST envelope Ideally post it off between Monday & Thursday
