Frank Nathan led a discussion about the arrangements for Saturday's Fete at St Edmund's Church, Pangbourne Street, Wembley (20th November). Preparations have been busily underway, and the next two days will be spent setting up the various stalls. We need to be flexible in our approach, as space is at a premium. On Saturday we are urged to arrive at 6.00 am to complete the set-up for an 8.00 am start although some customers are likely to be there well before that time. Those who can should wear their Rotary shirts and caps, and we should park away from the Church at places such as the Wembley Autocare on Grantham Street. The Kids Alley section needs some young people to man it, so any available grandchildren should be roped in asap!
