NEWS FROM OUR LAST MEETING

Richard Seale from Front Porch Films addressed the Club today, and his question is: If you want to record the story of one person who has influenced your life, who would it be? Richard started his working life as an engineer, but he realised that “when people take the time to share their stories, and others take the time to listen, something happens: everyone feels more connected”. As a young man Richard was inspired by an art teacher named Mrs Spencer, but she died before he could discover her story, and so the opportunity was lost. As a result Richard changed tack, and became involved in visual story telling – an example being ‘Love at the Embassy’, a five minute video about Betty Brown who met her husband-to-be at the Embassy Ballroom. It was a very sweet and humble story about a lovely lady. Richard likened the making of such films to a painter painting a portrait; it is an interpretation of a person at a moment in time. Richard starts the process with an interview, and in time the end result can be an extended story (about 30 mins) or a 5 minute condensation. Food for thought!
