20TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CHARTER DINNER OF FLOREAT ROTARY CLUB

The Rotary Club of Floreat was formed by the forward thinking parent club of Subiaco led by it's president the late John Flower.

The first meeting of the provisional Rotary Club of Floreat was held at the Floreat Hotel on June 18,1969, and was addressed by District Governor Bill Hollywell with 11 visiting Subiaco members, three visitors and 31 members present. "Getting acquainted with Rotary" was the appropriate theme of his address.

The Rotary Club of Floreat received its charter on June 30, 1969, in Subiaco's 20th year of existence, although the Charter night was not

Subjaco's 20th year of existence ,although the Charter night was not held until November 1, 1969. It is appropriate that the celebration of our Club's 20th anniversary should be held exactly 20 years after the Charter Dinner, in our 21st year.

The Floreat Club's initial President was Ron Cohen, and Subiaco's President at our Charter Dinner was the late Bob Hatfield. District Governor at this time was Len Wearne with District Governor's Special Representative, Keith Jenkins.

Over the last 20 years the enthusiasm of club members has never waned, their support for the community and deserving causes has been direct, and the fellowship and staunch friendships formed have been uplifting and supportive to us all.

Following are very brief summaries of local events over the past two decades.

As well as these commitments there have been these ongoing activities:-

- * 14 Rotary Exchange Students have been received by club members into their homes, and 18 Exchange Students chosen by our club for similar experiences overseas. Details of these students are listed later.
- * The club has hosted and also successfully recommended graduates for Rotary Foundation Fellowships.
- * Each year the club sends at least one young person to a youth leadership course -Ryla- and has been responsible for the organisation of this course on several occasions.
- * The club has for many years had a large representation on Rotary District Committees.
- * One member ,Bill Thornton, has attended numerous overseas Rotary International Conferences ,and others have attended such conferences at different times.

The club's inaugural president, Ron Cohen, with his fellow directors set a very high standard of service which has been maintained over the years, such that at the end of last year, with John Gordon as our President, in excess of \$231,000, in current dollars, had been raised for charitable purposes.

The Club's 21st President Kim Clifton and his fellow Directors are currently arranging a major project to continue the Club's charitable work ably into the start of it's third decade.
