Extract from Rotary in Review – Rotary International



After discovering new perspectives and being inspired by new ideas at the 2022 Rotary International Convention, attendees and virtual participants are looking ahead to next year's gathering in Melbourne, the sparkling second city of Australia.

This vibrant hub of art, sports, and cuisine will host the 2023 convention, set for 27-31 May. Rotary members, participants, and supporters are invited to Imagine What's Next and explore the possibilities for Rotary's future.

Our commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion will also be an important focus during the event, which will be packed with thought-provoking speakers and practical breakout sessions. Rotary members in the Host Organization Committee are planning activities to show visitors why their city is known for world-class sports, cultural diversity, exceptional dining, and inventive street art.

Anyone who **registers** by 15 December will pay a reduced price.

The 2022 convention in Houston, Texas, USA, offered plenty of inspiring moments as Rotary's global network gathered in person for the first time since 2019, following two conventions that were held virtually because of COVID-19. The convention offered participants new horizons to discover through in-person events and a robust schedule of virtual offerings (with recordings available through 31 August).

A Rotary first

During the closing session, Rotary International President-elect Jennifer Jones gave members a preview of what she'll be focusing on.

"For the past two years, the most common question I have received is, 'How does it feel to be our first woman president?" Jones said. "I will confess, I feel a sense of excitement brewing because I believe this opens opportunities for lifting and celebrating each of our diverse perspectives."

"We've all taken a different path to get here," she continued. "Some because your father was a Rotarian, some because an employer tapped you on the shoulder, others because a Supreme Court ruling permitted women to join ... and yet each of us entered through one mechanism — an invitation.

"That is why I am determined to harness diversity, equity, and inclusion to advance this invitation across the Rotary world."

Jones also called on leaders throughout Rotary to be trailblazers, and pledged to continue President Shekhar Mehta's Empowering Girls initiative, which she said, "has resonated powerfully around the world."

Other highlights from Houston:

- The Rotary Presidential Conference Houston: Serve to Bring Peace brought together peacebuilders from • around the world to reflect on Rotary's response to conflict this year and reinforce our commitment to creating more peaceful and resilient societies.
- Rotary's response to the war in Ukraine was acknowledged several times during the convention. Rotary • International President Shekhar Mehta praised members for donating millions of dollars to help displaced Ukrainians. "They opened their hearts and homes...I saw from close quarters how Rotarians were caring for them. Seeing was believing," he said.
- Dr. Olha Paliychuk, a member of the Rotary Club of Cherkasy, Ukraine, thanked Rotary on behalf of the more than 1,000 members in Ukraine. "You have not only donated and shipped medical supplies and other daily essentials to those of us inside Ukraine, but also provided shelter to those who have fled," she said. "Your help has saves lived, giving us hope and inspiring Ukrainians like me to stand up, to help our people, and protect our homeland."
- Nobel Peace Laureate Kailash Satyarthi spoke about the work of the Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation to end the exploitation of children in India and around the world by addressing the inequality, injustice, and discrimination that lie at the core of child labour. Following his remarks, Mehta presented Satyarthi with the Rotary Award of Honour for his advocacy of children's rights globally.
- Dr. Hamid Jafari, director of polio eradication for the World Health Organization's Eastern Mediterranean Region, shared an update on Rotary's progress in ridding the world of polio. "Through your entrepreneurial spirit, you have energized and inspired other partners to never give up. You are the glue that holds us all together, motivated, and accountable," he said. "You have led us from the start of global efforts to eradicate polio, and we will be together at the end of polio."
- Antoni Slodkowski, a 2003-04 Rotary Youth Exchange student from Poland to Japan, is the 2021-22 recipient of the Rotary Alumni Global Service Award. Slodkowski, Tokyo correspondent for the Financial Times, previously served as a bureau chief for Reuters in Myanmar, where he led coverage of the election of Aung San Suu Kyi and of the military crackdown on Rohingya Muslims, receiving the 2019 Pulitzer Prize for International Reporting.
- Gen. Charles Duke (USAF Ret.) NASA astronaut, Lunar Module Pilot and 10th man to walk on the moon during the Apollo 16 mission, spoke of exploring new horizons.



GUEST SPEAKER: MR ALAN SENG

TOPIC: NFTs, The Metaverse, and the opportunities within

President Louis invited PP Mark Wang to introduce the Speaker, Mr Alan Seng who is the Founder of Founder of Dark Zodiac NFT (nonfungible token) project which sold all 3,876 NFTs as one of Singapore's first successful NFT project, raising \$1.4 million. He is an early investor and advisor of game-fi platform Ethlas Metaverse which sold all 8,377 NFTs, raising \$2.5 million; platform raised \$2.7 million seed funding from prominent venture capitalists like Sequoia Capital, Venturra Capital and Hustle Fund. Mr Seng is Co-founder and Partner of Darkmeta, an NFT studio and consultancy firm to enable brands get into the NFT space.

Mr Seng noted that NFTs are the hottest trend in town for the past year and it was not slowing down. In his presentation he gave members a closer look at what NFTs are, why some of the biggest brands in the world are investing in NFTs, and where the business and investment opportunities are in this industry.

OPENING REMARKS

President Louis Lim warmly welcomed members and guests to the meeting as well as proposed the toast to Rotary International, followed by the Club's best wishes to birthday and wedding anniversary celebrants.

MAJOR PROJECT 2020/2021 UPDATE

IPP Dinesh Sharma was invited by President Louis to give an update on the Major Project undertaken during his term in office. He noted the importance of the Club's Major Projects for the benefit of the newer members. He explained that the Major Project recipient was Willing Hearts, a secular non-affiliated charity run by volunteers to meals to the underprivileged. IPP Dinesh noted that due to the COVID-19 pandemic there was a need to increase the capacity from 7,000 to 20,000 meals per day. The Club decided to support this need by providing the central kitchen equipment to the highest international standards with a market value of S\$250,000.00 and contributed S\$170,000.00 towards this project.

This Kitchen was named WH Rotary Halal Kitchen and is an iconic project for the Club. It was inaugurated on 12 May 2022 by Minister Mr Edwin Tong and blessed by leaders of different religious groups. He thanked all the donors for their generosity, particularly major donor Rtn Tom Wolf who also assisted in sourcing and inspection the kitchen equipment. He further thanked the project team comprising PP Tapan Rao, PP Stan Low, VP/PN Dr Chan Siew Luen, Rtns Tom Wolf and Subhash Pritmani.

THE FOUR-WAY TEST & THE GUIDE TO DAILY LIVING

President Louis called on Rtn Joseph Chia who recounted how he got to know about the Four-Way Test just prior to his introduction to the Club by PP Stan Low. Rtn Joseph informed members of the historical background and formation of the Four-Way Test as an ethical guiding principle by Rtn Herbert Taylor who later became President of Rotary International (RI). Rtn Herbert devised the message to be used by him and his staff to save his company from bankruptcy. Subsequently the Four-Way Test was adopted RI as a guiding principle as a standard by which all behaviour should be measured. Rtn Joseph noted that the Club also has its own way to encourage good character and PDG Dr Philbert Chin will advise members.

Next, PDG Philbert noted that his talk would be impromptu, and recalled how the Guide to Daily Living came about as he saw the need as Rotarians to have more than the Four-Way Test and evolved the Guide with the 4 questions to put to oneself. PDG Philbert added with vigour that the Guide prioritized living and puts order in life, firstly with reflection, secondly the importance of family, thirdly to pledge to be the best in one's profession/vocation and last to commit to service both far and near. He summarized that the Guide is a reminder of values as a Rotarian that needs to be practised by Rotarians. PDG Philbert stated that the Guide to Daily Living complements the Four-Way Test message meant for business and the Guide is for life!

that to apply the Four-Way test message, PDG Philbert came up with the Guide to Daily Living. Rtns Louisa and Vineet open the floor and









- Will it be beneficial to all concerned?



The Guide to Daily Living

Before doing the things we want to do, consider first, the Precepts of the guide. Ask ourselves these 4 questions and act upon them:

First: Have I spent some time in self-examination?

Second: Have I spent quality time with my family?

Third: Have I given my best to my work?

Fourth: Have I given some time to someone near and far?

The Guide, in fact, encompasses the 4 parts of the Object of Rotary.
