

Meeting Report 41st Club Meeting for Rotary Year 2020-2021 held on 5.5.2021

OPENING REMARKS

Sergeant-At-Arms Rtn Jean-Philippe Lionnet invited President Dinesh Sharma to open the Meeting, after reminding members of the meeting etiquette.

President Dinesh called the meeting to order with a warm welcome to visiting DG Gajendra from Rotary Club of Indore Dynamic and the Guest Speaker, Mr Karthee Vidya who is the CEO and Founder of Team Everest NGO.

TOAST TO ROTARY INTERNATIONAL



President Dinesh called upon one of the newest members to the Club, Rtn Leonard Ong to raise a toast to the Rotary Club (RC) of Indore Dynamic coupled with the toast to Rotary International.

President Dinesh invited DG Gajendra from the RC Indore Dynamic to address the Club. DG Gajendra advised that his club in central India has many places of interest to visit and he hoped after the pandemic, that a friendship visit could be made between the clubs. He noted Rotarians' passion to help the community and recounted incidents of support where

Rtn Leonard Ong Global Grants supplying ventilators, ambulances and oxygen supply have helped save lives. He gratefully acknowledged the Club's support.

WHAT'S HAPPENING



- President Dinesh highlighted the situation of COVID-19 affected India and the Club's goals to assistand enhance capacity and capability of Rotary Hospitals and COVID Centres; working with Rotary Partners in India. He added that the work would be through Global Grants (GGs) as far as possible; fund raising would be from both internal and external resources.
- He informed members of at least two proposed GGs an oxygen plant, PSA to increase capacity by 200T per/hour, for Rotary COVID-19 hospital in Purulia, West Bengal (amounting to US\$59,733) and another project to supply medical equipment in Bhopal in Madhya Pradesh for US\$36,470.
- President Dinesh further described the Club's response with a Start to 1M
 Vaccinations with an initial 5 Centres to be set up at the following Rotary locations:
 1) Bhubaneswar Rotary Eye Hospital
 - 2) Cuttack Eye Hospital
 - 3) Balasore Rotary Bhawan
 - 4) Angul Rotary Bhawan
 - 5) PURI Rotary Bhawan

Kalinga Institute of Medical Sciences will provide the medical staff and technical assistance. The 2 pilot projects will be conducted wherein $50000 \times 2 = 100,000$ vaccine shots will be administered. The project will be financed through Global Grants and fund-raising.

Rtn Sean is the CEO APAC of Smollan Group/DKSH Smollan and has been with the Smollan Group for 19 years and shared the organisation's mission for its employees and clients. Rtn Sean advised that in 2014, he and his family moved to Singapore.

Rtn Sean spoke of what it meant to be a Rotarian and defining moment in helping the community through the Club and the International Service Committee. He warmly thanked members for the opportunity to share about his life.

GUEST SPEAKER: MR KARTHEE VIDYA TOPIC: TOUCHING A MILLION LIVES

President Dinesh called on Rtn Marcelo Monteiro who introduced Mr Karthee Vidya who is the CEO and Founder of Team Everest NGO. He noted the Mr Vidya would be be speaking on a subject on education of children which was of interest to Rotarians.

Mr Vidya spoke of the journey he took to promote volunteering, which he hoped would inspire members. He added that his father was a past Rotarian, and he grew up seeing him volunteering and his mother was a teacher in a rural school. He spoke of his

volunteering experiences and recounted how in August 2006 with his first salary cheque he visited a rural school and provided school supplies. Mr Vidya shared how he balanced his office work and Team Everest volunteering. Subsequently, he quit his high paid MNC job in December 2014 to work full time at Team Everest.

He spoke of Team Everest's vision to inspire every Indian to volunteer and shared the NGO's programmes and of the Ï am the Change"Scholarship which sponsors 850 students. He showed a brief video of some of the recipients' overwhelming reaction upon receiving their scholarship.

Rtn Subhash Pritmani warmly thanked Mr Vidya for a wonderful and inspiring presentation.

Meeting Report 42nd Club Meeting for Rotary Year 2020-2021 held on 12.5.2021

KYFR KNOW YOUR FELLOW ROTARIAN

President Dinesh noted that KYFR Speaker PP Dr Yap Lip Kee joined the Club in 1994. PP Lip Kee advised that he was born in Pudu, Kuala Lumpur. He added that cycling past the Pudu Jail on his way to school was a reminder to be on the straight and narrow path!

PP Lip Kee spoke of his career and involvement in endoscopic surgery, and to do away with traditional surgeries and to adopt keyhole or minimally invasive surgery methods. He introduced his family comprising two daughters, a son, and his wife Rachael, whom he met whilst they were in medical school in Aberdeen.

PP Lip Kee continued with a summary of his Rotary journey through the many projects which he participated. He recalled VP Colin Miles's assistance with the SMS donations which garnered \$640,000 for the 2011 tsunami relief fund and the donation of set of Japanese drums. The visit by the Club led by PP Stan Low to Miyake to clear debris from a children's playground. The visits to earthquake-stricken Nepal with PP Jimmy Ooi and Rtn Jasbir Koh and Philippines projects with PPs Dr Oliver Hennedige and PP Perlita Tiro. He spoke of the Club's visits to China, Lombok, Jayapura Papua, Bhutan, and Kenya where he assisted and shared keyhole surgery knowledge. PP Lip Kee highlighted his visit to the 2019 RI Convention in Hamburg. He hoped in 2024 when the Convention would be hosted in Singapore that it would be a physical Convention.

GUEST SPEAKER: MR TAN TIN WEE

TOPIC: TIME IS NOW FOR A BIODEFENCE FORCE IN EVERY COUNTRY AND EVERY CITY: DEFENDING HUMANITY FROM EXISTENTIAL AND BIOTERRORIST THREATS

President Dinesh invited Rtn Bruno Massote to introduce Mr Tan Tin Wee who is the founding director and current Chief Executive of the National Supercomputing Centre (NSCC) Singapore since 2015.

Prior to his talk, Mr Tan noted that our hearts go out to all those who are suffering during this pandemic, but he emphasised the need to focus on prevention steps for the future. He highlighted the existential threats to the world with Covid-19 and

variants emerging and re-emerging diseases, antimicrobial resistance and superbugs, zoonotic leap from animal to humans, climate change driving changes in disease patterns, bioterrorism and Disease X. Mr Tan noted the urgent threat mitigation for Singapore being a global city and air travel hub with a busy sea port and heavy dependence on global supply chains. He added that Singapore was one of the densest cities in the world with high visibility and high value targets.

He advised that there were recent warnings with SARS 2003, Swine Flu, Zika, Hendra, Ebola and MERS, but wondered if the country was organised well enough. Mr Tan stressed the need for a "7th Pillar for Total Defence" – BioDefence! He added that now was the time to act. Mr Tan graciously answered the many queries posed to him by members.

President Dinesh called upon Rtn Sean Lim who warmly thanked Mr Tan for sharing his philosophy and insightful presentation.

At the close of the meeting, members were informed that Mr Tan was amazed by the projects undertaken by the Club and pledged a donation. (Subsequently, Mr Tan donated S\$2,000 to The Rotary Foundation.)




