

In Focus

Public health is on everyone's mind due to the global pandemic that still threatens the safety of ourselves and our loved ones. In a sense, COVID-19 has made all of us much more aware of the roles and responsibilities of medical professionals than we were before we had to wear masks and maintain social distance. In addition, while moving through this pandemic, we have also learned about the role we can play in keeping others safe.

December is Disease Prevention and Treatment Month in Rotary. The pandemic unfortunately has schooled most people on the toll that disease takes on our communities. But fighting disease is something that Rotarians around the world have been doing for decades. In fact, it is one of Rotary's seven areas of focus.

As Rotarians, we believe that good health and well-being is a human right — even though 400 million people across the globe do not have access to essential health services. The work we do in establishing clinics, eye hospitals, and blood banks, as well as in building infrastructure for medical facilities in underserved communities, all returns to a central belief that access, prevention, and education are the keys to stopping deadly outbreaks that harm the most vulnerable.

My exposure to health work began with my Rotary club, Calcutta-Mahanagar. There, among other things, I helped pioneer a program called Saving Little Hearts that over the years has provided more than 2,500 free heart surgeries for children from India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Nepal, and Africa. Before the program went international, it started locally with the goal of performing just six surgeries within our community. Today, our goal is to complete another 20,000 surgeries over the next five years.

The world relies on Rotary to tackle challenges like these and to set an example for others. Over the past decade, medical professionals and government workers have provided free health services to 2.5 million people in 10 countries during Family Health Days, which are organized by Rotarians around the world. Similar health camps in India also provide thousands of surgeries to those in need. Medical missions from India to Africa each year are an excellent example of hands-on service in disease prevention and treatment. Rotary members can also get involved at a local level; clubs in the United States and Mexico, for example, fund a free health clinic in Guerrero, a small town in Mexico.

And of course, our effort to eradicate polio is by far the best story in civil-society health care.

This month, think about how your club can focus on preventing and fighting disease. This is the time to take a bigger, better, bolder approach through both club and district projects that can impact more people. Re-evaluate where you are with your goals. Create strategies that can sustain change over years, not months.

Everyone deserves a long, healthy life. When you Serve to Change Lives, your actions today can help extend the lives of others.



Meeting Report

21st Club Meeting for Rotary Year 2021-2022 held on 24.11.2021

OPENING REMARKS

Honorary Secretary Jessica Lim opened the meeting and called on Sergeant-at-Arms Dr Claus Dusemund who reminded members of the meeting etiquette, before inviting President Louis Lim to conduct the meeting.

PRESENTATION OF PROJECT PINAY

President Louis welcomed Rotaractors (Rotr) Grace and Chloe from the Rotaract Club of Singapore and invited them to address the Club. Starting with Rotr Chloe who gave a brief background of Project Pinay which aims to educate Filipino girls ages 12-18 years old about sexual education to empower them with sexual rights and knowledge about pregnancy. Secondly, the Project seek to Improve their quality of life through teaching the girls to make reusable sanitary pads in a sustainable way. Further aims are to empower Rotaractors and provide them with a platform to learn and discuss the widely considered taboo topics of sexual health and menstrual education. Rotr Chloe introduced the Project's partners - Rotaract International District 3800 as well as Sister Club, Rotary Club of Rizal West.

Next, Rotr Grace described the Project's timeline, programmes and funding involved. She then requested members support for this Project, in particular the funding of the sanitary pads, welfare for the village communities involved as well as transportation fees to access the rural villages.

PP Perlita Tiro highlighted that she presented this project as well to the International Service Committee as well since it needed the support of the Sister Clubs and should engage the entire Club in this project. President Louis added that was the purpose to have Rotrs Chloe and Grace to share the information and that there are other Rotary Clubs which could be tapped upon to support the Project. Youth Service Chair, Rtn Mukundan A P also thanked PP Perlita for her support and assistance with this project.

CLUB'S MAJOR PROJECT

President Louis reminded members of the Club's Major Project for this Rotary year (RY 2021-2022), the Share-a-Pot@Home programme which would impact many lives. He added that the fund-raising target is \$108,000 with still a long way to go to reach this target. President Louis called on members support and contribute to the Major Project. He advised that should additional information on the project be required to let him know and the information would be sent.

KYFR KNOW YOUR FELLOW ROTARIAN

President Louis called on a new member, Rtn Jacqueline Koh as the KYFR Speaker, to share about herself and how she got involved in social work and became a Rotarian.

To start her sharing, Rtn Jacqueline shared a brief video "Faces of Prudential" which highlighted her involvement in community work. Rtn Jacqueline continued her sharing based on the 4-Way Test and she spoke of her humble beginnings and the opportunity given to her as a recipient of the scholarship offered by the Rotary Club of Changi which enabled her to pursue her degree programme in Australia. She spoke of her service as the President of the International Student Association and University Union and the insights gained from this experience.

GUEST SPEAKER: MR DINESH SINGH TOPIC: GETTING TO KNOW FRCS

President Louis called on PP Jimmy Ooi to introduce Mr Dinesh Singh, the General Manager of Foundation of Rotary Clubs Singapore (FRCS). PP Jimmy noted that the Club is a member of FRCS which is charity arm of Rotary Clubs in Singapore was formed in 1993. He advised that Mr Singh has over 25 years of marketing, business development and sales experience with a strong understanding for branding and marketing strategy. He previously headed the Membership Department of The National University of Singapore Society. He is a regular speaker in various marketing conferences and a regular contributor to marketing journals. Mr Singh is an active civic member of society

and served in the Singapore Indian Education Trust and is President of the Club Managers' Association and Vice Chair of Sikh Welfare Council.

In his presentation, Mr Singh shared the background, vision, mission, and currently ongoing units of FRCS. He highlighted the work of the Rotary Family Service Centre located in Clementi and West Coast which supports an average of 500 individuals and families each year. He spoke of the FRCS Learning Centre established in 2018 offering courses and conferences to serve the community which was open to Rotarians and their families. Mr Singh advised members of the scheduled launch of the FRCS Eldercare and Caregivers Centre in the 3rd quarter of 2021 which would serve 2,500 seniors in the Bukit Batok West Avenue 5 area. He described the key features and programmes of the centre. He further informed of the social enterprise company wholly owned by FRCS – HealthSafe Pte Ltd which provides deep cleaning and disinfection services of medical devices. In addition, he will share how Rotary Clubs can leverage on their charitable foundation to further their clubs' projects. He will highlight real life working examples on the impact of the joint collaborations of Rotary Clubs and FRCS.

President Louis invited PP Dr Yap Lip Kee wo extended the Club's vote of thanks to Mr Singh for his great talk.

PRESENTATION OF PROJECT KAMLEANG

Before closing the meeting President Louis invited Rotaractor Chu Yuan also from the Rotaract Club of Singapore to inform members of Project Kamleang in the Siem Reap area, Cambodia for the education of young girls human trafficking and sexual health. The project will be undertaken by 4 Rotaract Clubs in collaboration with partners such as Rotary Club of Phnom Penh and Angkor Hospital. Rotr Chu Yuan gave the project timelines, education topics and requested for assistance in sponsorships and funding as well.
