

Heartiest Congratulations

As announced by President Louis at the 26th January 2022 meeting, the Club extends heartiest congratulations to Past Presidents (PP) Philip Leong, Mansoor Hassanbhai and Dr Shahul Hameed on their re-appointments to the Panel of Advisors to the Youth Court, Family Justice Courts, Republic of Singapore.

Following is an article provided by PP Philip Leong:

As requested by PP Shahul, I pen below a short description of the role of The Panel of Advisers (POA) to the Youth Court, Family Justice Courts, Republic of Singapore.

The photos show the re-appointment ceremony for another two years by President Halimah Yacob at the Istana on 26th January 2022.

Caption of photos:-

PP Philip Leong (Past Chairman) served 33 years on the POA.

PP Mansoor Hassanbhai, not present at the ceremony, served 15 years on the POA.

PP Dr Shahul Hameed served closed to 10 years on the POA.

"Under the Children and Young Persons Act, (CYP), the role of the POA is to advise the District Judge of the Youth Court on the most appropriate sentencing option(s) to 'rehabilitate' Not 'punish' the juvenile offender (note: 'offender' and Not 'criminal'). There is no police record for juvenile offenders in Singapore.

The other role under the CYP Act is to advise the judge on the most appropriate option(s) to shelter and protect an abused child. In addition, the POA also advises the judge on the most appropriate option(s) to deal with a child that is beyond their parental control and is brought to the court by the parent(s).

At each open court session, on the top bench, there will be two advisors to flank the judge who sits in the middle."


30th Club Meeting for Rotary Year 2021-2022 held on 9.2.2022

OPENING REMARKS

MAJOR PROJECT ROTARY YEAR (RY) 2022-2023

PE James Lee thanked President Louis for the opportunity to present the Major Project for RY 2022-2023 with FootballPlus, an organization familiar with the Club having completed a major project with them during PP Keith Harrison's term. He added that in the coming year, the project would build two 7-aside football pitches to benefit over 3,500 children/youth in the programmes to enhance mental well-being as well as a values-based programme called Champions United.

PE James invited Mr Loh Ngiap Tai, Managing Director of FootballPlus who gave a comprehensive presentation of project. PE James also welcomed incoming Vice President Rtn Tom Wolf, who together with incoming Director Rtn Andy Mankiewicz were assisting with the fund-raising for the Major Project. Rtn Tom noted that there was a great deal of interest in the project and this year was the year for soccer with the World Cup, which would bring positive feedback for the Club.

PE James noted that with no objections the Major Project for RY 2022-23 would proceed with the signing of the MOU with FootballPlus and looked forward to members' support.

GUEST SPEAKER: MAJOR PONNO KALASTREE TOPIC: WHO ARE THE PERANAKAN INDIANS?

President Louis invited Rtn Anita Gannavarapu to introduce the guest speaker, Major Ponno Kalastree who started his security and investigation industry in Singapore after retiring as a Major from a distinguish military service in the Singapore Armed Forces. He formed his first Security company, Mainguard Security Services (S) Pte Ltd. in 1974. He is well recognized amongst his counterparts in the Security & Investigation Community, both locally & globally. He was the President of the worldwide organization called Council of International Investigators in the year 2000 – 2001. Major Kalastree is

passionate of his roots as a Peranakan Indian. He was among the founding members of the Peranakan Indian (Chitty Melaka) Association Singapore. He is currently the Association's President.

To start his presentation, Major Kalastree showed a short video which gave a glimpse of the rich culture of the Peranakan Indians. He further spoke of the history of Peranakan Indians (Chitty Melaka) with its origins of Indians who came to Southeast Asia almost 1,000 years ago. He described the cultural identity of the Chitty Melaka community as an integration of the multi-ethnic elements of religious practices, cuisine, language and attire.

Rtn Uttam Kripalani warmly thanked Major Kalastree for an eye-opener of a presentation which highlighted the origins and traits of the Peranakan Indians.
