On Sunday 3rd October, over 17 Rotarians, with some family and friends for support, as well as local Rotaractors, joined with over 140 other people to support the Sindhu Association in their quarterly blood donation drive.

The Rotary Club of Singapore has been a longstanding supporter of this community event, which has been run by the Sindhu Association for 43 years. Our support includes providing volunteers to man the registration booth, as well as assisting with the rental fee for the hall. Not to mention the most important part of the day, donating blood!

In October, I'm happy to share that from the 143 potential donors, we managed 120 successful donations throughout the six-hour donation period. This is slightly less than the 140 donations made in July, but considerably more than previous years. Also, when considering the prevailing covid19 restrictions, this was a fantastic achievement.

This event happens four times a year with the next donation drive scheduled for Sunday 2nd January. On behalf of the Rotary Club of Singapore, the Community Service Committee, the Sindhu Association, and the people who receive the lifesaving blood, thank you to all of those who donated, and I look forward to seeing you, and your family & friends, again in January.

GUEST SPEAKER: MR GAURAV KRIPALANI TOPIC: HOW COVID KILLED THE ARTS

To introduce the Guest Speaker Mr Gaurav Kripalani, President Louis called on Rtn Aarti Wadhwa who advised that Gaurav concluded his tenure as Festival Director of the Singapore International Festival of Arts (SIFA) for 2018 – 2021. Originally a three-year appointment, he was asked to stay on for an extra year to helm the national arts festival through Covid. In May this year, he presented a hybrid festival of 60 shows, over 200 performances in person and online – which was one of the largest arts festivals to take place anywhere in the world since the onset of this pandemic. Concurrently, Gaurav is the Artistic Director of Singapore Repertory Theatre (SRT) and has produced over 100 plays during his 25-year history with the company. Under Gaurav's artistic direction, SRT was the first Singaporean theatre company on Broadway in 1998. This was for Golden Child, which went on to earn three Tony Award nominations.

Gaurav also recognises the importance of education with SRT being one of the biggest commissioners and producers of children's theatre in Southeast Asia through SRT's The Little Company, as well as SRT's learning and engagement programmes with schools. In 2020, SRT partnered with Rotary to create an educational platform to address cyber-bullying in schools.

Gaurav noted that he has had the opportunity and privilege to address the Club on a couple of occasions, however he noted that this time was probably the most important for the Arts, hence the title of the talk, because the situation was dire. He started by giving a brief overview of SRT and the arts landscape and its importance in Singapore. He spoke of how Covid dealt a massive blow to the arts and not just in terms of finances, but that a generation of young people who have had to stop their engagement with the arts, as well as the struggle to hire talent back to the arts since they have left the industry.

Gaurav also spoke about "Silver Linings", he noted that many have suffered due to Covid and not just in the arts, but this has given us the opportunity to do things differently by creating online content. He spoke of the collaboration with other theatre companies. He concluded by adding that whilst these were challenging times, great things were in store, and he called on members to support the Arts and buy a ticket! Gaurav graciously answered queries posed to him by members and shared his opinions on various topics including a possible collaboration with Rotary for the RI Convention in Singapore.

President Louis called on Rtn Adnan Ansari who thanked Gaurav for his very touching and emotional talk which was greatly appreciated.

END POLIO NOW (EPN) DRIVE

Rtn Adnan Ansari reminded members of the annual programme to End Polio. He added that polio cases have been reduced to 99.9% with just two countries reporting cases of wild poliovirus – Afghanistan and Pakistan.

He reminded members of the Club's End Polio Drive to be launched on World Polio Day on Sunday, 24th October, and end on 24th December. He added that registration for the Drive's walks would be US\$50.00 or S\$70.00. He urged all members to invite their families and friends to give significant contributions to the End Polio Now programme.

The club pioneered many projects for the community ranging from providing hydroelectricity, solar lighting, shelter, and donation of wheelchairs. He further highlighted to members the District event on 24th October. He added that the Club as well as the District will have many End Polio Now (ENP) programmes and he called for members' generous support by purchasing the ENP merchandise such as the bomber jackets and wristwatches.

Rtn Pauline Teo started her KYFR presentation advising that she is the Executive Director of 8VI Holdings Ltd. which is a listed company and that her role was to inspire more people to take charge of their financial wealth. Before 2011, Rtn Pauline was a civil servant for 10 years, and believed

FIRESIDE CHAT WITH GUEST SPEAKER: MR DOUGLAS GOH
TOPIC: ROTARY & SDO COLLABORATION FOR DIGITAL UPLIFT OF MICROBUSINESSES, AND SENIORS AT THEIR
WORKPLACES

To moderate the Club's 6th Fireside chat, President Louis called on Sergeant-at- Arms Rtn Vineet Iyengar who introduced the Speaker Mr Douglas Goh. Mr Goh is Director (Strategy & Planning) SG Digital Office, Infocomm Media Development Authority (IMDA). In his introduction, Rtn Vineet informed members of Mr Goh's illustrious career in the Singapore Navy where he held several command departments. He has been bestowed with National Day Awards for Public Service in the military and the Commendation Medal as well.

The SG Digital Office (SDO) was set-up in June 2020 to mobilise a whole-of-nation movement to accelerate Singapore's digitalisation by building on and ramping up existing efforts to equip every individual and business, including our seniors and small businesses, with digital tools and skills to participate meaningfully in the new social and economic environment post COVID-19.

Mr Goh shared insights of their anchor programmes of Hawkers Go Digital and Seniors Go Digital which were both launched in 2020. He highlighted the achievements such as the boost of hawkers' adoption of e-payments with transaction volume and value growth. He further noted that SDO has exceeded its reach of and adoption targets for seniors in its first year with high satisfaction level and sustained learning. Mr Goh also spoke on other measures and initiatives to support hawkers' digitalisation.

Mr Goh summarised what was being done to enhance the seniors go digital curriculum to embrace an enriched digital lifestyle. He sought support as corporate partners to extend their outreach to seniors and digitally less savvy employees as part of their new SDO@workplace initiative introduced last month.

Following Mr Goh's presentation, a lively discussion was held among members with Mr Goh and his team members present.

President Louis called on Vocational Service Chair, Rtn Sonali Sinha to extend the Club's vote of thanks. Rtn Sonali warmly thanked Mr Goh for taking the time to speak to the Club on all the initiatives. She shared that at the start of the Rotary year with the concern of the digital divide and how to assist businesses, the Committee reached out to SDO/IMDA team who were so supportive and were looking forward to scaling the hawker centre project to perhaps more centres. Rtn Sonali thanked Mr Goh and his team once again.

Before closing the meeting, President Louis reminded members of the signing ceremony for the Club's Major Project for the year, the Share A Pot@Home programme with Yishun Health on Wednesday, 27th October from 4.00 to 6.00pm followed by a webinar to launch the programme.

Visiting Rotarian DGN Jerome Rajendram spoke of his club's fund-raising event for the End Polio programme and invited members to participate in a virtual gold tournament to be held from 14th to 20th February 2022. 
