

What have you learnt in the last 2 years?			
Delfyan :	I learnt to be hardworking and resilient		
Klayton :	I learnt about teamwork and I want my team to make it to Champions League		
Nuarim :	I learnt to be humble, kind, caring and respectful		

What was the highlight or favourite moment of the programme?			
Delfyan :	When we went to Germany and I made new friends.		
Klayton :	It was in the Singapore Youth League and my team was losing. I was the goalkeeper and opponent kicked the ball into the net. I lost grip of the ball and opponent kicked the ball and I saved it for the second time. It was a double save.		
Nuarim :	On 16 Feb every year, Football Plus will buy me a birthday cake and I always request for vanilla cake because I love vanilla.		

The children are 3 out of the many children supported under the Football Plus programme.

# **MAJOR PROJECT 2024/2025**

The Rotary Club of Singapore partnered with Football Plus in 2022 under its Major Project 2022/2023. In this project, the club supported underprivileged children through various academic and football programmes managed by Football Plus. The objective of the programmes was to uplift the lives of these children through football over their formative years which is a crucial period leading into adulthood. The programme includes an incentive trip to play with Borussia Dortmund (initials BVB) in Dortmund, Germany.

The progress of the children under the programme were monitored since 2022 and were shown to be improving in terms of overall well-being, attendance in school and school work.

As shown in the pictures above, they are full of enthusiasm playing football which gave them physical fitness and a sense of purpose and belonging. Their attendance in school improved since 2022 and based on data collected, the attendance rate improved by 4%, with a particular case improving by 9.5% translating into additional 18 days in school. Their school work also improved with 67% of the children showing improvement in one subject, 33% improved in 2 subjects and 70% showed improvement in overall grades.

Seeing the success of the programme under Football Plus, the club decided to renew the partnership with Football Plus for another 2.5 years until 2027. This time, the partnership will include Teen Challenge, a faith-based rehabilitative organization for ex-offenders. The 3-way partnership will come under Major Project 2024/2025.

Under Major Project 2024/2025, the club raised \$789,102 including government matching of \$378,109. The funds will be used to refurbish the football field within the premises of Teen Challenge and to pay for programmes to support underprivileged children under Football Plus and ex-offenders under Teen Challenge for the next 2.5 years from 2025 until 2027.

Football Plus is a non-profit organisation which achieved its IPC status in 2014. The organization aims to support underpriviledged children in their overall well-being and development through sports and academic support. Research has shown that children from underprivileged backgrounds tend to lag behind their peers from more affluent backgrounds. They lack the moral and financial support and often suffer from high rate of absenteeism resulting in high failure rate. Football Plus was formed

with the objective of helping these underpriviledged children by giving them the support group with a systematic structure of sports training and academinc support.

Teen Challenge is a faith-based non-profit organization which aims to support exoffenders through sports and help them rehabilitate back to society. It is believed that sports is therapeutic and will help the ex-offenders in their physical, mental and social well-being. Through such support, the ex-offenders can regain their self-esteem in order to assimilate back into society.

President Tom Wolf gave a detailed explanation on the partnership with Football Plus and Teen Challenge including the fund raising drive to support the programmes under these 2 organisations for the next 2,5 years from 2025 until 2027.










## FOOTBALL PLUS FINANCIALS ANALYSIS AS OF 31st.DEC 2024 (IPC STATUS)








## MAJOR PROJECT FUNDRAISING STRUCTURE












# Interact Challenge Via Zoom (Organised by the Interact Coordinating Committee)
