7TH CLUB MEETING:

A Night of Fellowship and Insights on Cancer Care

27 August 2025 - Our 7th club meeting was called to order by President Sonali, who warmly welcomed members and guests to an evening of camaraderie and learning. The formal welcome of guests was conducted by Rotarian Vineet Sarangdhar, who introduced a distinguished lineup of attendees, including our guest speaker Dr. Akhil Chopra, several family members of Rotarians, club prospects, and visiting Rotarians from clubs in India, Russia, and Australia. Special mention was made of Professor Alexei Svetlikov from the Rotary Club of St. Petersburg, White Nights, who extended an open invitation to all for their club's 25th anniversary celebration in November.

The meeting featured a vibrant exchange of Rotary banners, with PP Stan presenting a banner collected from RC Malacca durina their installation ceremony. This tradition of banner exchange continues strengthen our bonds with Rotary clubs around the world and serves as a reminder of our shared commitment to service.



President Sonali's report highlighted a week filled with Rotary fellowship and collaboration. She recapped a successful gathering with past presidents from RC Makati Paseo de Roxas, as well as a delegation's visit to Kuala Lumpur for the installation of the RC KL DiRaja club and the signing of a new sister club agreement. She also reminded everyone about the ongoing End Polio Step Up Challenge, encouraging participation and donations to support Rotary's global health initiatives.







Looking ahead, President Sonali announced several upcoming events, including the Youth Service Committee meeting, a trip to Shenyang from 10–17 September, and a fully booked visit to Malang in early September. Members were also invited to consider joining the International Rotary conference in Bhutan this December, with details available via the club's WhatsApp group.

The highlight of the evening was an engaging keynote by Dr. Akhil Chopra, Senior Consultant Medical Oncologist at OncoCare Cancer Center. Dr. Chopra traced the evolution of cancer care over the past 50 years, from the early days of surgery and chemotherapy to today's advances in precision medicine, immunotherapy, and artificial intelligence. He emphasized the importance of early detection, personalized treatment, and holistic patient care, offering hope for the future of cancer management.

The meeting concluded with a heartfelt vote of thanks delivered by IPDG Dr. Yap Lip Kee, who praised Dr. Chopra's accessible and insightful presentation. President Sonali closed the meeting by inviting members to continue their fellowship and announced that next week's meeting will feature a discussion on "Agentic AI: Are they here to augment our capabilities or to replace them?"

2ND YSC MEETING: YSC ADVANCES PLANS FOR EMPOWERING THE NEXT GENERATION

28 August 2025 - The Youth Service Committee (YSC) held its second monthly meeting on 28 August 2025 at the Foundation of Rotary Clubs (Singapore) Ltd., with an agenda that underscored the committee's growing role in quiding Rotaract and Interact clubs. Members reviewed the minutes of the inaugural meeting and finalized preparations for the upcoming Rotaract Club of Singapore (RACSG) Installation on 30 August. This installation, open to Rotarians and youth members, promises to be a lively occasion of fellowship and service spirit.



The meeting also focused on the work of the Interact Coordinating Committee (ICC). Advisors outlined ideas for collaboration among Interact clubs, including project exchanges, End Polio Now fundraising walks, tree-planting initiatives, and social media engagement through Instagram and TikTok to boost visibility. Plans are underway for large-scale Interact meets and programme exchanges, aimed at strengthening connections across schools and building long-term community impact.

Reports from Rotarian advisers highlighted progress from three Rotaract clubs and nine Interact clubs under YSC's guidance. At RACSG's first board meeting, members discussed signature projects like Project Bethelax and Project Pinay, as well as fundraising avenues through corporate and foundation grants. Meanwhile, the RI Interact Board meeting emphasized cross-club and cross-border collaborations, project sustainability, and the inclusion of engaging activities such as "Dine in the Dark" to inspire greater youth involvement.

A highlight of the session was the presentation of the Career Symposium proposal by RACSG City. Set to be hosted at Singapore Management University between 3–7 December 2025, the event will bring together 200 students, university mentors, and industry professionals for panel discussions and networking over dinner. With a modest budget of \$2,900 and strong alignment to YSC's mission of youth empowerment, the symposium promises to prepare participants for a fast-changing job market while strengthening Rotary's visibility among young leaders.

Looking ahead, the committee confirmed the collection of hosting fees and discussed upcoming initiatives, including quarterly joint meetings with Rotaractors and Interactors, as well as the introduction of the Rotary Youth Protection Certificate. The next YSC meeting is scheduled for 25 September 2025, with a renewed emphasis on inclusivity by inviting youth representatives to attend. Through these efforts, the YSC continues to serve as a vital bridge between Rotary and the next generation of changemakers.

Committee chairs reported on upcoming programs: the Active Aging Bowl & Bond initiative for seniors, progress towards the TRF fundraising target, ongoing Polio initiatives, and plans for the Rotary Crossroads bulletin with new features like a Membership Corner and a first 100-Day report for this Rotary Year. The Board also confirmed participation in the FRCS Flag Day on September 6 and the FRCS SG60 Commemorative Dinner on September 27. The meeting closed with appreciation to members for contributions their commitment to strengthening fellowship and service.
