10TH CLUB MEETING:

17 September 2025 - The Rotary Club of Singapore hosted an extraordinary evening featuring Madam Halimah Yacob, Singapore's first female President and current Chancellor of the Singapore University of Social Sciences.

District Governor Dr. Shahul Hameed warmly welcomed Madam Halimah and the distinguished guests, setting the tone for an engaging dialogue on community service and leadership.

During the meeting's initial segment, the club recognised several visiting Rotarians (list later). presented Α banner exchange took place with Ms Sonia Salaria, President of Rotary Club of New Chandigarh (District 3080, India), symbolising the international fellowship that is a hallmark of Rotary's global network.

The formal welcome of the guests was done by Rtn Louisa Lee and the toast to the Republic of Singapore and to Rotary International was done by PP Mansoor Hassanbhai.

President Sonali highlighted the Club's recent achievements, including the ongoing dialysis center project at Willing Hearts, the the Children initiative Help supporting 500 underprivileged school children, and the Active Aging Bold and Bond program. The Step Up Challenge to end polio was also discussed, with 16 club members participating and four donors pledging support.









Upcoming events were announced, including the International Service Committee meeting, food package distribution, and the Jolly Walkers event at the Botanic Gardens. The club also shared excitement about upcoming charter anniversaries of partner clubs and the muchanticipated Deepavali party.



PP James Lee was honored with the Rotary International Avenues of Service Award, recognizing his outstanding contributions across Rotary's five key service areas — Club, Vocational, Community, International, and Youth Service. This prestigious award celebrates Rotarians who exemplify "Service Above Self" through leadership, ethical professionalism, impactful community projects, global goodwill, and youth empowerment. The award crystal was personally presented to PP James by IPDG Lip Kee, marking a proud moment for our club and a testament to his dedication and exemplary Rotary spirit.

AN EVENING WITH MDM HALIMAH YACOB: REFLECTIONS ON COMMUNITY, SERVICE, AND THE ROLE OF ROTARY

In an exciting panel discussion facilitated by DG Shahul Hammed, Mdm Halimah delivered a powerful message about unity, social cohesion, and the importance of focusing on shared values. She spoke extensively about engaging younger generations, particularly Gen Z, emphasizing their passion for social causes and the need for flexible, meaningful engagement.

Addressing the challenges of polarisation, populism, and misinformation, Mdm Halimah stressed the importance of sincerity, hard work, and face-to-face connections in building trust. She encouraged Rotarians to create opportunities for young people to lead and innovate, suggesting the club could set aside a budget for youth-led projects.

The dialogue covered a range of topics, from mental health and support for underserved communities to the challenges of modern leadership in a digital age. Mdm Halimah shared personal insights about parenting, leadership, and the importance of recognizing individual strengths beyond academic achievements.







The evening concluded with a vote of thanks, with Rotarians expressing deep appreciation for Mdm Halimah's inspiring words and her continued commitment to community service. The event exemplified Rotary's mission of bringing people together to create positive change and build understanding across generations and communities

3RD ISC MEETING

18 September 2025 - ISC's third meeting of the year was hosted by IPP Tom Wolf. ISC Chair Navaneeth led the session, welcoming attendees and guests from partner clubs, including Rotarian Rajiv from RC Mumbai Inspire.

Highlights included the successful "Know Your Partner Club" session with RC Kuching Central, and updates on recent fellowship visits to RC KL DiRaja, RC Muar, and RC Malacca.

Rotarian Rajiv shared insights into the Mumbai Inspire Bursary Project, which RCS has supported with \$17,000, emphasizing its impact on underprivileged students and encouraging broader inter-club collaboration for future funding.

Updates were also presented on the Shen Yang and "Help the Children" projects.

The committee approved a \$1,000 contribution to RC Delhi Akash Metropolis for their Clean-Up Drive Project, supporting environmental efforts across 12 Interact clubs.



The committee reviewed the existing Disaster Relief Policy, which previously set a standard approval of \$2,500 per disaster without specifying a fundraising target. Following the recent Sabah Flood Relief initiative—where member generosity exceeded expectations and raised \$13,000—the committee agreed to include defined fundraising targets for all future relief efforts. The ISC Chair will set these targets based on whether the affected area falls within or outside the district. For in-district disasters, RCS will coordinate with the District Governor to allocate any surplus funds appropriately, either to the District Relief Fund or back to the club.

Members also began outlining guidelines to define the distinction between partner and sister clubs, to be finalized in the next meeting.

Invitations to attend RC BSB and RC Taipei installations in October were shared before Chair Navaneeth concluded the meeting at 9:15 p.m.
