Before the formal meeting started, Dr. Shahul held a customary meeting with the Board. While it was very light hearted, it was clear that the District Governor had high expectations of his home club and the Board had no plans to disappoint.



The main event was action packed as the Club Assembly provided all the service (Community, directors Vocational, International and Youth) and other board officers with an avenue to share recent accomplishments, highlighting ongoing projects and future plans. The highlight of the announcements was the much anticipated formal introduction of the President Nominee candidate, Rtn. Jens Rubbert, as proposed by the Nomination Committee.





Amidst the celebrations, a special induction ceremony was held to officially welcome Jeremy Anthony to the Club. Rtn Denis Hew, Jeremy's father, beamed with pride, but it was clear that everyone shared in the joy of having Jeremy officially onboard.

PE Raj also announced the nominated Board for Rotary Year 2026–27. The lineup was met with cheers and applause, reflecting a perfect blend of experience and youthful energy — a true representation of the year PE Raj envisions.

As per Rotary tradition, these nominations will be formally confirmed at the Annual General Meeting in December, provided there are no challenges from the floor. This meeting marked the official announcement of the nominations for the upcoming leadership roles.

President Sonali introduced the evening's proceedings, setting the stage for the district governor's address. The meeting was attended by club members and their spouses, creating a warm and supportive atmosphere for the important visit.

Shahul's keynote address Dr. was masterclass in Rotary leadership purpose. He emphasized that true Rotary leadership is about inspiration, not control. The Governor introduced his "triple three guide" concept, focusing on three key tools (awareness, knowledge, action), three pillars (innovation, continuity, partnership), and objectives (strengthening three clubs, creating lasting change, and uplifting the Rotary Foundation).





A significant portion of Dr. Shahul's talk centered on the importance of creating lasting change through Rotary projects. He shared powerful examples from his experience, illustrating how Rotary can transform lives beyond short-term charitable efforts. The Governor challenged members to think deeply about project impacts, not just immediate outcomes.





The District Governor also addressed the critical issue of membership, presenting a color-coded analysis of club sizes across the district. He highlighted the challenges faced by smaller clubs and encouraged a strategic approach to membership growth and club sustainability.

A passionate advocate for the Rotary Foundation, Dr. Shahul spoke extensively about the power of endowment funds. He shared a vision of building a substantial endowment that could generate ongoing support for impactful projects, encouraging members to consider leaving a lasting legacy through planned giving.

President Sonali delivered the vote of thanks, expressing gratitude for the Governor's inspiring address. She particularly appreciated his insights on project impact and the potential for creating meaningful, long-term change through Rotary's work. The evening concluded with a group photo, capturing the spirit of fellowship and shared purpose.

- Society for the Aged Sick Donation of 150 bento meals from Fullerton; plans for a CNY project in the works.
- New Life Stories Global Grant application in progress; coordination ongoing with district leaders.
- Mad Cash Project Explore joint project proposed with VSC, supporting 10 beneficiary groups.



#### **YOUTH & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

- Learn Dialects Mobile App Monthly sessions planned with YSC to connect youth and seniors through dialect learning.
- Toy Buffet / Food from the Heart (FFTH) Toy collection drive and pop-up fair scheduled for 14 November.

#### MIGRANT WORKER INITIATIVE

Plans are underway to revive the successful sports and social program with the Hope Initiative Alliance, which previously improved well-being and community ties among migrant workers through cricket and leadership activities.

**7 October 2025 -** The Board met at Silversea Katong for a productive session led by President Sonali Sinha. After approving the previous minutes, members discussed updates, plans, and key initiatives for the year ahead.

#### STRATEGIC PLANNING

Building on discussions from the Board Retreat, the team refined the Club's Strategic Plan using the Rotary International Framework. The focus was on leveraging the Club's strengths — active committees, impactful projects, and strong fellowship — while addressing challenges like membership retention and volunteer balance.

#### **OUR SHARED VISION**

"To be a dynamic, diverse, and trusted Rotary Club that unites people of action to create lasting impact in Singapore and beyond."

Committees will continue refining their goals and track progress through a shared project tracker.

#### **MEMBERSHIP UPDATES**

Two new members joined the Club, and there are 31 prospects in the pipeline. Engagement remains strong, with many new Rotarians actively taking part in meetings and service activities.

To celebrate our 95th Anniversary, the Board approved a 50% discount on entrance fees for spouses and children of members, valid until March 2026.

The Board also explored creative ways to bring in younger professionals, including partnerships, digital outreach, and reconnecting with former Rotaractors.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Hon. Treasurer Pia Bruce shared that the Club's finances remain strong and stable. The Board discussed maintaining healthy reserves and exploring options to manage funds more efficiently for better returns.

#### **BOOK OF HUMOUR UPDATE**

Rtn. Varun Gulati shared that 8,000 copies of the Book of Humour have been sold, and a refreshed edition is ready to launch subject to the content being reviewed. The Book of Humour Trust aims to support more service projects in the coming year.

The meeting ended on a cheerful note, with thanks to Rtn. Hitansh Vij for hosting.
