## **International Projects**

Cambodian Hospital Equipment Container Project

- 6 containers sent cost \$20,000
- Funding Approximately \$11,000 in donations from other companies and individuals to support this project

Sangora Project

• We have sent 3 nurses to assist in the training and system improvements to improve their infection control standards, pressure care and other nursing education (Kareen Dunlop, Mandy Ribeiro and Sam Jennaway)

ECU Nurses

- In October 8 ECU student nurses and their supervisors spent 2 weeks in Cambodia, doing health checks with street kids and in the hospitals.
- Supported by Rotary Sausage Sizzle fund raising and by the Sangora Project funding

Donation in Kind

- Links developed with Donations in Kind.
- Pip Asphar now a representative on the committee
- More than 50 Wheelchairs for Kids sent to Safe Haven Outreach, Siem Reap

### Interplast

- 2016 District 9455 sponsored a program to Cagayan de Oro in the Philippines.
- They consulted 53 people and operated on 40 patients with 57 procedures performed. Important training was also undertaken
- Fundraising 2016-2017 \$70,000
- Donations from 23 Rotary Clubs, 5 individuals and Rotary Conference contributions.
- RC Osborne Park donated \$ 4,000
- 2015 the visit to the Solomon Islands included supporting Rockson with the repair of a severe cleft palate problem.

### Shelter Boxes

• \$4,000 donated to Shelter Box to support disaster relief around the world Cosmos Health Care

\$1,000 donated to Cosmos Health Care for Community health projects in Zimbabwe
