Rebuilding Queensland's economy

Queensland's economy was weak before coronavirus.

Unemployment was the highest in the nation and small business confidence the worst in a decade.

Build new and better roads and rail

Congestion on our roads is getting worse under Labor, especially on the Bruce.

The South East will continue to grow with almost two million more people estimated to call it home over the next two decades.

This means more pressure on existing infrastructure like roads, schools and hospitals.

Labor have cut the capital infrastructure budget by almost \$3 billion dollars a year, because they haven't managed the budget responsibly.

We understand that local road congestion is a major issue and that if nothing is done, the problem gets worse.

An LNP government will deliver key upgrades and have a priority list for delivery. We will manage the budget and focus government spending where it is needed.

We won't ignore the need for better roads and infrastructure as Labor has done for the last five years. We're committed to getting everyone home sooner and safer.
