There has been a great deal of activity on site, particularly on the roster days when volunteers from Rotary Clubs were in attendance to assist with the packing of containers.

On 9th March, there was in excess of 60 Volunteers representing 14 Rotary Clubs giving their support to Donations in Kind Northern Region. A 40' container destined for Port Moresby was packed with school furniture and books. This container is now on the way to Port Moresby. The Rotary club of Cleveland made a start on their container for Lae and Bren Milson and his crew from District 9640 put the finishing touches to their container for Dili in Timor Leste. Volunteers not needed for the packing of the containers helped with the sorting and packing of books in the store.

The next roster day on the 6th April saw 35 volunteers in attendance from 7 different Rotary Clubs. A 20' container for Manus Island was packed. This is a project of

Island was packed. This is a project of Wantaim PNG, a community group on Manus, supported by Lynne Shori, a Rotarian of the Rotary Club Manly in Sydney. Donations in Kind is giving support with the arrangement of the logistics of getting the container to Manus Island. Progress was made on the packing of another two containers on the day, one by

the Rotary Club of Mooloolaba for the Western Province of the Solomon Islands and the other by a group of Rotary Clubs of District 9600 destined for Mougulu in the Western Province of PNG
