NOTICE OF TEMPORARY CLOSURE

As the impact of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) continues to grow across our communities, Rotary Australia World Community Service Donations in Kind Northern Region has made the decision to suspend activity at the Donations in Kind premises at Kingston until further notice.

This decision has been made in response to directives and policies as issued by the Government and Health Authorities as well as advice from Rotary Australia World Community Service.

The following will come into effect from midday on Thursday 2nd April 2020;

The Rotary Australia World Community Service Donations in Kind Northern Region premises at Kingston will be closed from midday on Thursday 2nd April 2020 until further notice.

No deliveries will be accepted into the store after midday on Thursday 2nd April until further notice. New combination locks have been fitted to both gates. The new combination will not be issued at random and for security and safety reasons, nobody is to access the site after midday on Thursday 2nd April 2020 without prior approval of the management of Donations in Kind Northern Region.

We will continue to monitor the directives from Government and the Health Authorities and a notice will be issued as soon as it is deemed to be safe to resume activities at the premises at Kingston.

We thank you for your understanding and cooperation during this unprecedented time.

We look forward to the date when this closure will be lifted and we can get back to work on the realisation that changes will have to be made in our work environment.

OPERATION NEW PREMISES

We have almost reached the half way point of the three year lease by Rotary Australia World Community Service over the Kingston site for Donations in Kind Northerm Region. We need to identify and secure a site for the future operations of RAWCS Donations in Kind Northerm Region. A prospective site has been identified and we are putting together a committee of experts to assess the site and to prepare a submission to secure the site. If successful, this committee would also be responsible for the planning and management of any works required to make the premises suitable for the operations of Donations in Kind.

If successful, this has the potential of being a permanent home for RAWCS Donations in Kind Northern Region.

Areas of expertise where input will be needed are as follows: •Town Planning to assess the use of the site

- •Engineering to assess the availability of services and to address any infrastructure that will be needed on the site
- Surveying for the design of connection of services and new infrastructure needed on site and possible lease surveys
- Building expertise to assess the current buildings and advise
 on possible alterations or renovations.

•Experience in preparation and documentation of submissions addressing the criteria as set out in the calling for any Expressions of Interest

SUCCESSFUL WORKSHOP

discuss strategies for the future direction of RAWCS Northern Region Donations in Kind

Due to the increased demand for the services being provided by Rotary Clubs, Rotary Clubs can no longer provide the same financial support and volunteer base that was provided up to a few years ago.

There is also increased requirements from external influences such as insurance requirements, Import and Export requirements both here and at the receiving end as well as meeting the requirements of the Australian Charities and not for Profit Commission.

RAWCS Donations in Kind Northern Region has to change to meet these challenges. Donations in Kind is a business and as such, we need to adopt "Best Practice Principles" in setting up a business model for the future viability of Donations in Kind Northern Region.

There was a very good attendance at this Workshop held at the Donations in Kind premises at Kingston on Sunday 1st March was very well attended with others logging into the Workshop through "Zoom"

Issues to be discussed at this Workshop included: Management Structure/Succession Future Permanent Home for Donations in Kind Workplace, Health and Safety Funding Documentation for Control of Goods In and Goods Out Insurance – Public Liability Thursday Volunteers for Sorting, Packing and Store Maintenance Volunteers on Rostered Days for Packing of Containers

A small group has started to assess the Workplace Safety and Health Management System and giving consideration to the requirements of this system and the decisions from the Workshop, a draft paper outlining site specific policies and procedures for Donations in Kind Northern will be circulated within the next week for comment.
