

Shepherd's Arms Medical Clinic



The Shepherd's Arms Medical Centre – Following years of holding a mobile medical outreach programs, establishing the clinic became Rizsa's dream. With the blessing of Martin and Amy, and with support of our amazing volunteers and donors, we've built a small medical clinic within the Children's Home grounds. The clinic will provide free basic health services (dental, eye checks, child and maternal health) to residents of the children's home and also to the vulnerable groups (children and the elderly) in the disadvantaged communities of Panglao Island, Bohol, Philippines. Basic health services in the area are out of reach by many poor families; hence, this is a much-needed community initiative. The construction of the medical clinic is completed and we are now in the process of fundraising for basic medical equipment and supplies. It is not too late to be part of this life-saving project. We are looking forward to opening the clinic soon!

NEW AQUAPONICS GARDEN



We're always keen to try new things to improve our garden. Following the success of our fishpond, Dexter started a new project – the aquaponics gardening system. It is a combination of aquaculture (fishpond) and hydroponics, growing fish and vegetables together! This is a very neat system in which the fish waste provides an organic food source for the plants, and the plants naturally filter the water for the fish. We are optimistic that this will increase our gardening capacity and yield, which is a move towards **self-sustainability**. We thank God for a generous donation that enabled us to do this.
