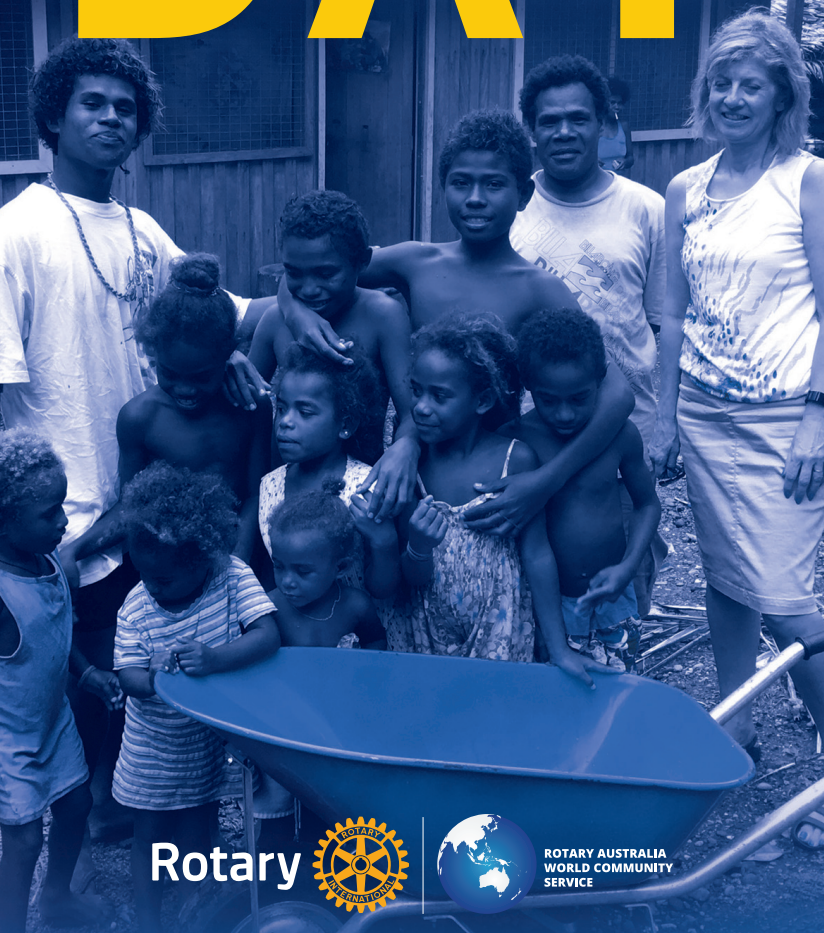

Malaria is still endemic in 104 countries, claiming the life of one child every two minutes. Yet malaria is entirely treatable and preventable with targeted help.

In 2015 Bill Gates and Ray Chambers, the United Nations Secretary General's special envoy for malaria, put forward a plan for eradicating the disease by 2040. Rotarians Against Malaria (RAM) started this mission in our Pacific region more than 20 years ago. With RAM's help the rate of malaria has dropped from 70% of the population to less than 1% in parts of the Solomons, and Timor Leste is on track to eliminate malaria by 2020.

RAM engages in many activities to help control and eventually eliminate malaria, including:

- Breeding ground destruction
- Distribution of long-lasting treated bed nets and surface insecticides
- Provision of diagnostic equipment
