As we present our first annual report, we reflect on the transformative year for Safe Water for Every Child – Philippines, Inc. (SWFEC-Ph). Founded with a resolute mission to ensure that every child in the Philippines has access to safe drinking water, our young organization has made significant strides in its first operational year, particularly in the underserved regions of Mindanao.

Our commitment to improving the health and well-being of children has driven us to forge partnerships with local communities, schools, government agencies, and local organizations particularly Rotary Clubs and our international partners SkyJuice Foundation and Disaster Aid Australia. # Safe Water for Every Child - Philippines (SWFEC-Ph, Inc)

## I. Profile:

Safe Water for Every Child - Philippines (SWFEC-Ph, Inc) is an independent SEC-registered non-profit organization committed to pursue the realization of the dream of making available safe drinking water for every child in Mindanao and in the whole country, village by village, school by school, thru the use of appropriate and sustainable technology such as the SkyHydrant Ultrafiltration System which was invented by Rhett Butler, AM who was just recently awarded the Zayed Sustainability Prize and the Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum Global Water Award for his invention.

Aside from reaching out to the barangays and public schools, we also respond to emergency situations of devastations caused by typhoons, floods, earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, fires, epidemics and internal displacements caused by violent conflicts thru the deployment of mobile SkyHydrant UltraFiltration units.

We build on the initial successes of Balay Mindanaw in the provision of safe drinking water to communities in Mindanao, installing more than 100 SkyHydrant units, 14 of which in the Bangsamoro. SkyHydrants were also deployed to the evacuation camps and transition shelters during the Marawi Siege. The most current emergency responses were conducted in the Bicol and Southern Luzon floods, and in the three-week water crisis caused by power outage in Siargao Island.

SWFEC-Ph Inc. works in partnership with two Australian organizations - Disaster Aid Australia and the SkyJuice Foundation.

## II. Background/Context:

In November 2002, the United Nations Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights adopted General Comment No. 15 on the right to water. Article 1.1 states that "The human right to water is indispensable for leading a life in human dignity. It is a prerequisite for the realization of other human rights".

Out of the Philippines' population of 115 million people, 60 million people (52% of the population) lack access to safe water. The situation in schools is even more serious, with 55% of schools lacking access to a safe water. The leading cause of health problems among school children are water-borne diseases caused by unsafe drinking water.

Worldwide, 844 million people lack access to drinking water, and 2.3 billion do not have access to latrines or other basic sanitation facilities. Contaminated water and poor sanitation are among the leading causes of death for children under 5. Without access to clean water, proper sanitation and hygiene facilities, children face an increased risk of preventable diseases, malnutrition and other critical health issues. (UNICEF)

An organized and sustainable program to address this deprivation of a basic human right is urgently needed.

There are more than 12,000 villages in Mindanao and more than 42,000 nationwide. More than half of these are desperately in need of safe drinking water. It looks like an impossible dream but we believe it could be done one step at a time, one village at a time. As of now, over a hundred units have been installed thru the support of and in partnership with Disaster Aid Australia, Skyjuice Foundation, Balay Mindanaw, various Rotary Clubs, various organizations and local government units.

Safe Water for Every Child - Philippines is composed of Rotarians as its core of leaders and volunteers.

### **III. Objectives/Components/Activities**

1. Provide sustainable safe drinking water to communities in collaboration with government and private agencies, local governments, individuals and institutions that share the dream of providing safe water to every child

Target and barangays in two years

Activities:

1. Networking with barangays and other local government units, academic institutions, Rotary and other similar organizations, national government agencies;
  2. Research and collection of health data especially on water-borne diseases especially among children;
  3. Conduct community needs assessment (CNA) of barangays and schools
  4. Conduct of orientation and training on the proper installation and maintenance of the SkyHydrant;
  5. Installation of the SkyHydrant units;
  6. Formal commissioning and turnover of the SkyHydrant units to local government and school authorities;
  7. Regular monitoring and provision of technical support to recipients
2. Respond to emergency situations of devastation caused by natural disasters such as typhoons, floods, earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, fires, epidemics and internal displacements caused by violent conflicts; Target: Deploy SkyHydrant UltraFiltration units in areas affected by disasters

Activities:

1. Conduct Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis in areas affected by disasters; ; Install SkyHydrant UltraFiltration units in at least one hundred (100) schools

2. Coordinate with local government units, local organizations and other stakeholders in areas hit by disasters;
  3. Mobilize and train Safe Water Action Volunteers;
  4. Deployment SkyHydrant units and distribution of safe drinking water to evacuation camps and communities hit by disasters
3. Engage and contribute to programs and projects aimed at improving the water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) condition of communities;  
Target/Objectives: Help increase the awareness of communities and schools in water, sanitation and hygiene

Activities:

1. Production and distribution of IEC materials;
  2. Conduct of WASH conversations in barangays and schools
4. Participate and exercise leadership in local, regional and international networking initiatives such as, but not limited to, WASH and health development, and community empowerment;

Target/Activities:

1. Organize knowledge-sharing and enhancement sessions;
  2. Attendance in gatherings, conference and other relevant activities
5. Develop organizational and financial sustainability through long-term strategic planning and appropriate resource mobilization and fundraising activities.

Target: Internal capacity-building and strengthening

Activities:

1. Training needs analysis;
2. Staff development sessions;
3. Regular meetings

# Executive Report

We hit the ground running in our inaugural year, making significant strides in our mission of providing safe water for every child. Our team successfully installed and turned over to various partners in barangays and schools **16 Skyhydrant Max** units, demonstrating our commitment to providing safe drinking water. Additionally, we delivered **6 units** for installation and deployed **5 units** for emergency response, showing our responsiveness and preparedness in critical situations.

## Inventory and Contributions

In total, we received **35 units** of ultrafiltration systems, comprising **32 SkyHydrant Max** and **3 SkyHydrant Gem** units. The distribution of the SkyHydrant Max units is as follows:

- **4 units** from Disaster Aid Australia
- **10 units** from the SkyJuice Foundation
- **16 units** from Disaster Aid Australia thru Balay Mindanaw
- **2 units** repurposed from existing installations

This collaborative effort underscores the support and partnership we have fostered with various organizations dedicated to improving water quality and accessibility.

## Future Deliveries

We are currently anticipating the delivery of an additional **30 units** of SkyHydrant Max, along with **100 Squirts-MS** and **500 Squirts** units from the SkyJuice Foundation. We are also hoping to receive continuing support from Disaster Aid Australia. These upcoming resources will further enhance our capacity to deliver clean water solutions to underserved communities.

## Looking Ahead

As we transition into our second year, we are setting an ambitious goal: to install and turn over at least **50 SkyHydrant Max** units across the nation, with a particular focus on the Mindanao region. This commitment reflects our dedication to expanding our reach and ensuring that safe drinking water is accessible to all, especially to children in areas that have historically faced challenges in water quality and availability.

Through our strategic planning and continued collaboration with our partners, we are poised to make an even greater impact in the coming year. Together, we will work tirelessly to provide clean, safe water for communities in need.

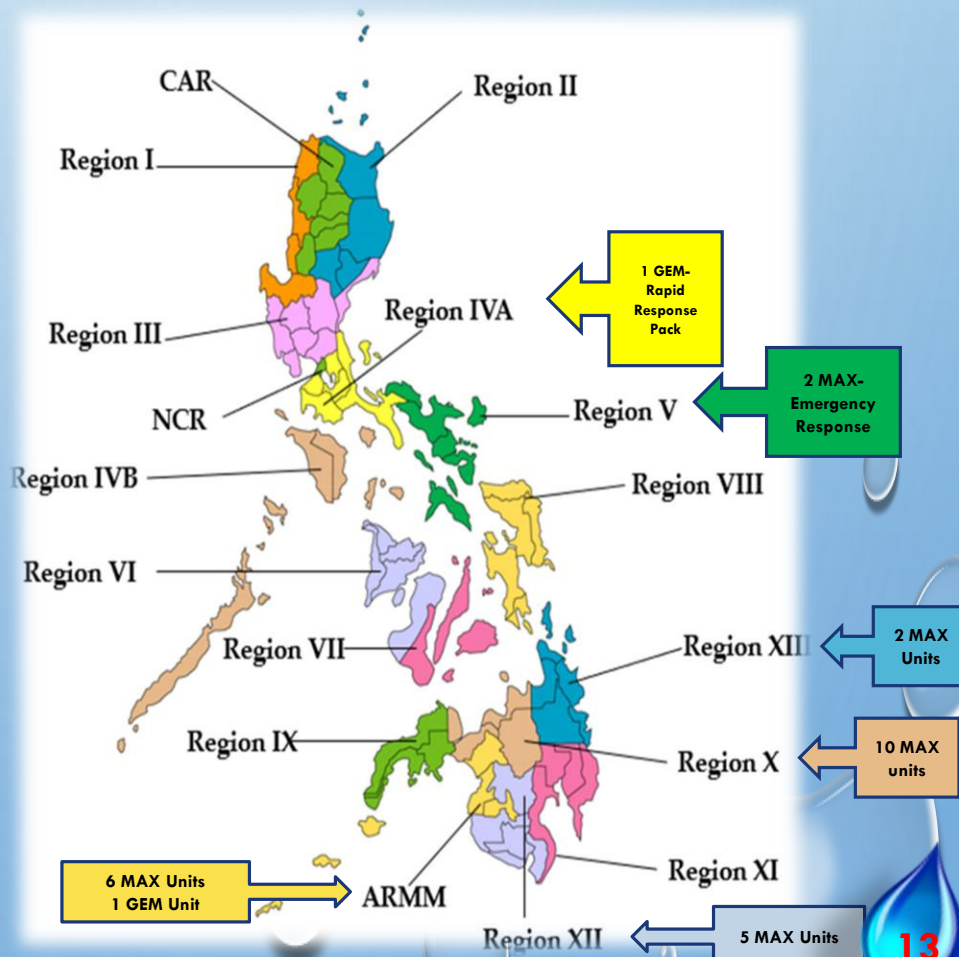

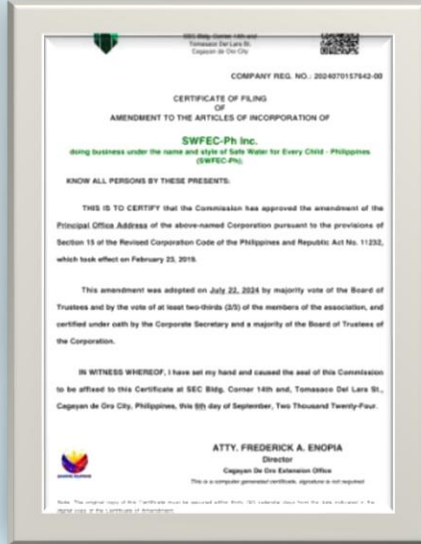

**REMINDEES:**

- An annual registration fee shall be paid upon registration and every year thereafter on or before the last day of January, using BIR Form No. 0605.
- Filing of required tax returns to conform with the above tax types, whether with or without business operation, to avoid penalties.
- For new business registrants, application for registration of manual Books of Accounts (BIAs) shall be before the deadline for filing of the initial quarterly income tax return or annual income tax return whichever comes earlier, from the date of registration. Registration of new set of manual BIAs shall be before its use.
- Immediately inform the district office in case of transfer/cessation of business and other changes in registration information by filing BIR Form No. 1905.
- For Self-Employed Individuals (SEI) whose gross sales and/or receipts and other non-operating income does not exceed P3,000,000 and who opted to avail of the 8% Income tax rate, the tax type Percentage Tax (PT) shall not be reflected in the Certificate of Registration (COR). However, at the start of each taxable year, such SEI shall be automatically subjected to graduated income tax rates and required to file quarterly percentage tax return (BIR Form No. 2551Q) and option to replace the COR to reflect "PT", unless qualified and opted to avail of the 8% Income tax rate annually.

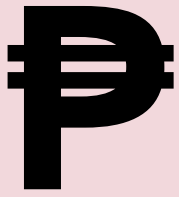

Consider this: out of the Philippines' population of 115 million, a staggering 60 million people—52%—lack access to safe water. The situation in schools is even more alarming, with 55% lacking this essential resource.

Globally, 844 million people are without access to drinking water, and 2.3 billion lack basic sanitation facilities. Contaminated water and inadequate sanitation are among the leading causes of death for children under five. Without clean water and proper hygiene, these children face heightened risks of preventable diseases, malnutrition, and severe health complications (UNICEF).

This deprivation of a fundamental human right must come to an end.

Let us unite in our commitment to ensuring that every child has access to safe, clean water. Together, we can build a future where peace is not just a word but a lived reality for all.
