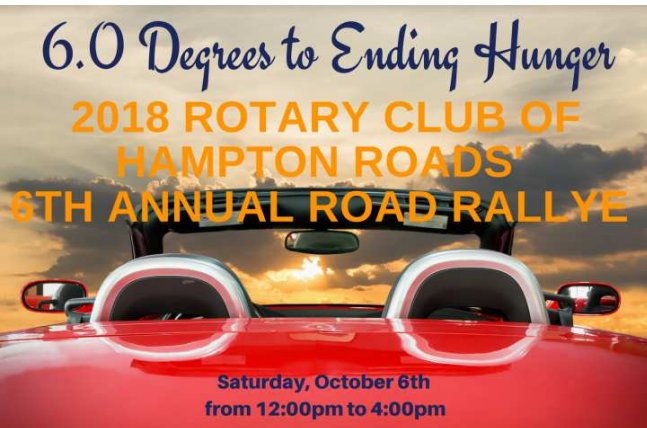
ABOUT ROTARY
