

Taking up the cudgel


It was a pleasure to have Richard Kelloway from the Veterans'
Centre Mid North Coast as our guest speaker. The centre was established in 2013 to facilitate veterans and their families connecting to rehabilitation and well-being service providers, monitoring timeliness and quality of services received, advocating on behalf of clients if services inadequate, and assisting with claims and appeals to the Department of Veterans Affairs.

Richard explained the two streams of assistance and the training that advocates and well-being counsellors receive, along with the growing demand for services.

It came as no surprise that younger veterans often have difficulty connecting with the institutions established by veterans from previous conflicts. It was also not surprising that each time the government re-jigs the legislation for the support of veterans, entitlements lessen.


It may have been because of the preceding fines session, but Richard spoke about the need to 'take up the cudgel' to support veterans to lessen the negative impact of their service.
