Ray Clayton was our speaker for the evening and he shared his experiences organising the annual Steam Rally as a member of the Rotary Club of Echuca Moama. The Club owns 10 acres of land on the banks of the Campaspe River, which was purchased in the 1970s. It has been developed into a park with a caretaker's residence, kitchen, office, showers and multiple machine sheds. It is also a free camp for RVs for up to 48 hours.

Held on the Queen's Birthday weekend, the Rally involves 180 volunteers including Rotarians from Rochester and Melbourne Central, Kiwanis, Lions and the Fire Brigade.

Between 400—500 exhibitors bring along their steam engines, tractors, veteran cars,



Clydesdales and buggies. Catering is a big job with 3,000 scones being whipped up and 1,000 serves of stew. Members get together to prepare pumpkins including chopping them up with axes! The peeled and chopped pumpkin then goes to a local pizza shop for transformation into soup.

A grand parade is held twice daily and Thomas the Tank was a big hit the year the Club paid for its participation. As are the petting zoo and pony rides.
