A little history ... on 17 May 2014, a group of about 30 young adults in Germany completed the building of a washing line 6.066 kilometres long with 69,152 socks pegged to it and set a new Guinness World Record. That record still stands but not for much longer!

Port Macquarie, NSW, Australia is where this record will be smashed in 2021. The challenge is being led by Rotary (we are deliberately not using our club name) and, as far as we know, it is the only major event in our District 9650 that is a celebration of 100 years of Rotary in Australia.
