Emily Buckle To Germany 2020



Well January came around a lot quicker than I was expecting... after saying goodbyes to family and friends at Coffs Harbour, I got on my flight alone and was on my way. The flight from Sydney to Singapore went pretty quick. But from Singapore to Frankfurt definitely felt like it was too long. Finally, after a day of travelling we made it to Frankfurt!!! This is where my host family would pick me up and I got met by my host dad and brother Maurizio and Loris and we drove home to our town, Ottersheim.

I tried my best to stay up all day on Saturday, but it got to 5 o'clock and I couldn't stay up any longer. I slept for the next 15 hours and was still so tired the next day. For my first day in Germany my family took me bowling and I went to my first German shop and took the dogs for a walk around my town.

On Thursday I had my first day at school at Max Slevogt Gymnasium where I'm in class 10B. My school is in Landau which means that I leave my house at 7 each morning to ride to the bus stop, which is definitely a big change from getting up at 8 each day last year. On my first day I met three girls (the only girls in my class) and they were super friendly and showed me around the school. The next day we had last hour free, so they

showed me around Landau, and we went and got lunch.

It hasn't snowed yet where I live, but my host family took me to Madenburg where we walked about 2km to a castle and along the way we saw remnants of snow, which was probably just ice. I also got to see my first Handball game, which was really good but definitely more intense than what I was expecting.

This week I met up with some other exchange students in my district. They've all been here for 5 months so they showed me around Mannheim, which is an hour from where I live. It was my second time going there and it is definitely different from the small village I'm living in. So far I'm loving Germany and have loved getting to know so many new people and especially the kids at my school. Although Germany isn't as cold as other countries right now, I am definitely not used to it but I'm slowly getting there.
