Blessed are the Cheesemakers*

Mother-and-daughter team Lyndall and Mel were our guest speakers and they gave a demonstration of how easy it is to make your own healthy, inexpensive yoghurt.

Members were taken with the idea of yoghurt at a cost of \$1.60 per kilo which isn't 26% sugar, unlike many commercially available yoghurts.

Located at the Big Banana, Mel and Lyndall offer workshops for home cooks, chefs and foodies of all skill levels, to learn to make cheese. Cheese is the oldest manufactured food, predating even bread.

According to Lyndall, who has been teaching cheesemaking in Coffs Harbour for the last 10 years (and making it at home for much longer!), making your own cheese is easier than baking a cake – and the results are far more versatile.

Workshops range from the entrylevel Soft Cheesemaking Workshop to daily one-hour express options, all taught in the sunny kitchens at the original banana plantation homestead. People fly in from as far as New Zealand to do Lyndall's courses.

Mel runs the shop which sells a wide variety of local and overseas cheeses, kits, equipment, cultures and rennet and kitchen tools.

I foresee many a yoghurt machine under the Christmas tree this year.




