

Saving Wildlife

The NSW Wildlife Information,
Rescue and Education Service or
WIRES is Australia's largest wildlife
rescue organisation. Jenny
Eather, local WIRES member and
specialist in the rescue and
rehabilitation of sugar gliders and
possums, spoke to the club at our
most recent meeting.

Jenny spoke of the 83,000 calls for help that WIRES receives and of the 2,500 trained volunteers across the state. Volunteers often feed young wildlife—macropods, koalas, birds and gliders—every two hours for weeks on end. All wildlife is rehabilitated & released

back into the wild. The territorial nature of many animals means that care has to be taken in choosing a release site.

Should you have time to spare in April, Jenny is looking for volunteers to help relocate disorientated Shearwater fledglings. The birds get distracted by the bright lights of Coffs and end up on Park Beach instead of heading north.
