

## No rows of desks

Nicholas told us that Bishop Druitt College is celebrating its 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year. In this time it has grown from 55 students to almost 1100, teaching pupils from kindergarten through to senior years. The college now ranks first among all the local regional high schools and colleges for results of its graduating senior students.

While the above was mentioned in passing, Nick focused his address on what is termed the Walker Learning Approach, a teaching and learning approach that personalizes learning in the early stages of education. The basic tenets of this is that the students and teachers form a Community Circle to set expectations both social and academic and then discuss and communicate their plans. Each

child in a class of about 16 becomes the 'focus' about once each fortnight when the teacher individually personalizes and extends the learning process using provocations and high interest area (could be dinosaurs). There is a reporter and photographer and parents are able to monitor the progress of their child via the computer if they wish. The classrooms differ quite radically from what we know as a classroom with everyday sensory and tactile areas (mini shops, plant nurseries, carpentry, electronic areas etc.)

This approach has seen a 25% improvement in BDC NAPLAN results.


