Pres Deb:	Before she made the presentation she wanted to thank her Club for all the support she has received before and after her sister's passing. Her sister Shannon lived in Gig Harbour for about 40-years. She spent most of her life as an educator. Which she loved doing; she was well respected by students and staff.				

Shannon had two recipes that she was famous for – they were Harbor Pasta and Rosemary Roasted Cashews.

Shannon had requested that instead of flowers, that would die, her friends please bring sweaters of all kinds and sizes to be delivered to the homeless. 700 plus items were brought it was all very overwhelming.

Deb also had an invitation card made in honour of her sister. Shannon wasn't a Rotarian but she lived a life of service above self. Deb requested folks to honour her sister by committing

hours of service or make a donation to a charity of their choice or to a resource to make a difference.

- P-Elect Roy: Introduced Marty Pearce from International Project Alliance (IPA) she has been active with that group since 2017. One of her visits was with Jill and Terry Greer.
- Marty Pease: Explained what IPA is:
 - A large collaborative group of Rotary Clubs in the Pacific Northwest who made a long-term commitment to helping the people of the Copan Ruinas regions of Western Honduras.
 - It was founded in 2014
 - Projects cover most areas of international aid, including education health, food and agriculture, water and sanitation, construction, and economic development.
 - Some of the problems in the Mahan Villages:
 - Access to education
 - Clean water
 - Electricity
 - Poor Nutrition

IPA has two major projects

1. Education: paying tuitions (kindergarten to college), providing school supplies, supporting and starting middle schools and trade schools, upgrading and adding to existing schools' physical buildings, providing electricity, working latrines and furniture, providing libraries, student health fund.

2. Rapid development based on the model of FXB, a Swiss program, bringing villages out of poverty in three years: education, business education and planning, micro financing, savings and loan, agricultural training, health care providers.

They have two main school programs, they have a rapid development plan put into place. The group works within conjunction of other groups. IPA helps with construction in the areas in which they work. Who can join the IPA:

• Rotary Clubs in northwest Washington State and southern BC.

Peter Martin of the Fidalgo Island Rotary Club is one of the founding members of the International Project Alliance (IPA).

Where they do their work in the Honduras there isn't a real big safety issue for ones welfare.

Days for Girls have also gone along with them to make a presentation and handout the mensuration kits to women. Jill mentioned that there have been men in the classes they want to know what is being handed out to the women of the village.

- P-Elect Roy: thanked Marty Pearce for the great presentation.
- P-Elect Roy: It was time for the PNW Rotary Club's Happy Basket to be passed around.

We once again heard some wonderful reasons why our members wanted to put in Happy or Sad Bucks.
