It was himself and college friends who thought it would be cool to organize a non-profit organization that would make an impact on the community of Whatcom County. They not only help with the raising of funds to provide children with backpacks full of food for weekends but help homeless and veterans through street outreach.

Phil spoke about the well-known fact that children learn much better when they aren't hungry. Their grades are much better when they have proper nutrition in them.



The story behind Starfish – a young girl was helping a large group of starfish that were stranded up on a beach. A passerby said to her there are too many to help; her reply was one starfish at a time makes a difference.

The dream of the Wildbird Charity is to have a program in all school districts within Washington.

He is kept very busy making purchases of the required food to go into the packs and supervising the packing of the backpacks and delivery of the food.

The elementary schools get a package with a logo on, the middle and high schools do not have any

markings to signify the program. Those schools need to have their food put double-bagged packages. The kids come and pick the packages up at a designated location in the school.

Help is needed in all areas: packing, shopping /ordering /purchasing / delivering of food. They welcome donations. It costs \$37.50 US / month / child to keep food in the backpacks.

They would welcome company sponsors.

It warms his heart to see the smiles on the children's faces when they pick up the backpacks and knowing he is making a difference in someone's life.

P-P Tim Thanked Phil for a wonderful talk on a very worthwhile project helping our children through the backpacks to getting a better education.
