Andy: Thank you to the Club for asking me to speak. First off I want to thank my good

friend Celeste Mergens for taking me with her on one of her Days for Girls trips to

Africa. Celeste now has a Days for Girls Podcast.

After the death of one of my son's and going through many stages of grief. I found my calling after it was suggested that I try something new, different, and something

she has wanted to do – such as climbing a mountain. After some thought she decided the mountain she wanted to climb was Kilimanjaro, Tanzania, Africa. It was after a trip to Africa seeing children unable to get an education due to lack of funds for a school that Andy decided to build a school in the tiny village of Ngomano. It was no easy feat but after lots of hard work, many many phone calls she was able to start her dream of a school.

The Clay International Secondary School was started as a free coeducational school in 2005 to support rural students in Kenya whose families could not afford public high school fees.

126 Clay boys and girls live on campus in boarding facilities, and 12 faculty members live in campus housing, in the remote village of Ngomano, in Makueni County 110 miles from Nairobi.

Completely funded by private donors through Project Education Inc., (PEI) Clay School is a unique collaboration with parents, students, and a Kenyan staff of educators and mentors.

Over the years they have added other buildings to the school, such as small guest buildings. If you'd like to take a trip with Andy after COVID she'd love to have you join her to see what can be done with a vision, hard work, the support of family and friends.

Please find attached the wonderful presentation given by Andy. Her stories that went all with the slides were very inspiring.

Andy now volunteers with the Edison Fire Department. She had to pass the course to become a volunteer firefighter, and a course on emergency medical response.

P-Roy: Will your school be supplied with computers from the ARES program? Andy: Yes, the organization has been in touch with the ARES program.

Pati: After COVID is over – Tim & I will be touch to join you on one of your trips.

P-Roy: Thank you so much Andy for this very inspiring presentation today.
