Dan: Thank you for giving Glen and myself the opportunity to talk about a project that is very important to me, I've worked with this project for 20-years. I don't see myself retiring from it anytime soon.

The pandemic has slowed us up a little but we have managed to keep filling containers and sending them where they are needed. The lower mainland medical health facilities, and schools keep us supplied with product that is needed else where in the world. We



don't send out expired items or broken items. We have recently sent a shipment of PPE to Cape Town. They did not meet our government requirements.



I have travelled to countries to see the containers being unloaded and delivered to the villages where the supplies are needed. The joy hospitals and schools get when they see what is being brought to them is so heartwarming.

We have recently sent a container with the help of 15 clubs giving the required funds to meet the costs of getting the container to its destination. We hope to get another container loaded and shipped on April 10th. It will contain supplies to help rebuilt a library in the Philippines.

We will be holding a virtual AGM on May 13th.
