Sent an email to our Club advising of Jill's wonderful legacy to Rotary International foundation.

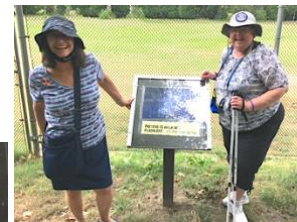
