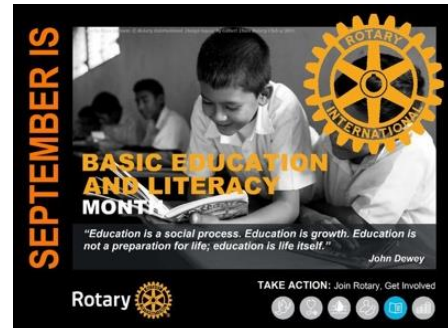

She secured an entrance scholarship last fall and was named a grand prize winner in the 2020-21 SFU Student-Community Engagement Competition. Since then, she's been pouring her energies into her studies and into fully realizing her prize-winning passion project, NaloxHome.

Chloe: Thanked us for being interested in her project NaloxHome. I am now in my second year at SFU.



I saw daily the problem of the opioid overdoses on the news. I saw the gap in a very dramatic and personal way two years ago when a young woman collapsed on my lap while on our skytrain heading home.

It was bothersome to me that I was Grade 11 going into Grade 12 and I had no idea what was happening,” says Goodison. She found out days after the incident that the young woman – about the same age as myself had overdosed. “Nobody on the train [that evening] knew how to treat her. Nobody had naloxone, and nobody knew the signs and symptoms of an overdose.

I did some research on the subject and saw where I could possibly help and do some good. I applied for a grant and was awarded \$5,000. for a website. I started small with a few friends and it has grown to be a group of over 100 students helping with this project. My dream is to expand this project to be province wide. I would like to see education on the subject of the Nalox kit given to all students.
