P Brian opened the meeting by calling for attendees to stand for the Thai National Anthem.

P Brian welcomed the Members of RC Hat Yai Nakarin (RCHYN) our new Sister Club and explained that 9 members of the club had made the long journey here on Monday 22nd March. A social gathering was held at the Greenway Hua Hin Resort on Monday nights to welcome them to Hua Hin with members of the Board and Past Presidents attending. The proposal for the Sister Club came from Rotarian Patrick Franssen who with his wife was a former member of the club.

Before dinner was served President Weesuda sangkhakul and PAG PP Penny Ritthikan presented

P Brian Anderson with some wine and homemade balm.

RCHYN received its charter certificate on the 8th July 1990 and currently has 19 members.

President Weesuda sangkhakul stated she and her club looked forward to working together and thanked P Brian for the warm welcome their members had received.





PAG PP Penny Ritthikan went onto talk about the 3 Sister clubs the RCHYN has in Malaysia and talked about the projects they have been involved in and looked forward to working with the RCRHH on joint projects in the future.

PAG PP Penny Ritthikan went onto say she and the members were impressed with the educational projects we were involved in at the Phetchaburi Panyanukul School and Anuban Hua Hin School.

P Brian then asked P Weesuda and PAG PP Penny to join Immediate Past President Napa, President Elect Phil to exchange club banners and the memorandum of understanding between the two clubs. Following this exchange gifts were presented to all the club members of RCHYN by P Brian.

P Brian then called upon Dr Keith Humphreys to talk about the TELK project.

Dr Keith informed the meeting that the RCHYN had attended the Phetchaburi Panyanukul School that morning and had a clear understanding of what the project involved.

Dr Keith went onto say that the TELK project was about teaching the teachers to fish, and not be given fish. Computers come in many forms however in his opinion they being used for listening to music, playing games or watching movies was no



to music, playing games or watching movies was not what they were designed for.

Teaching the use of computers is teacher led, however Technology Enhanced Learning was:

- A new concept of learning
- It is NOT about learning to use computers
- It is NOT about the teacher being the master of knowledge
- It does NOT expect all students to have the same level of understanding to learn

In Technology Enhanced Learning (TEL) the classroom is structured to allow children world access, self-determination and student collaboration.

In 2015 UNESCO declared that by 2030 all students at school would be using the internet as the main source of self-directed learning TEL is an internationally accepted term that refers to the use of any style of computer to assist the development of an individual's life-style.

The explosion of iPhone and other similar devices means that most people have access to computers to guide their daily living.

P Brian Thanked Dr Keith then called upon PE Phil Lawrence to talk about the RCRHH other



projects. PE Phil apologised to the members and guests that he would have to rush through this as time was moving on.

With regards to "Thai Voices" and the Technology Enhanced Learning for Knowledge (TELK) this had been covered in the morning and the TELK would be covered in the afternoon.

However, it was important to note that the RCRHH had recently proposed to pay 200,000 Thai Baht to establish a new website for the "Thai Voices" National Project.

With regards the TELK project 2,364,271 THB had been spent so far on phases 1 to 3 of the project plan, and another 586,000 Thai Baht to complete phase 4 of the project. This money was already available.

PE Phil went onto talk about the following projects:

- Donation of Hearing Aids and Lunch for the Sotsuksa Thepperat School for the Deaf August 2020 7,500 TB for the renovation of the hearing aids and 5000 TB for lunch.
- Mercy House Foundation September 2020 New Lockers for Dormitory 5,600 Thai Baht.





• Jungle Aid Student Sponsorship 18th September 2020- 20,000 TB

 Artwork for the TELK Classroom November 2020 28,300 TB

 World Polio Day Saturday 24th October 5,500 TB
