The President opened the meeting and following the Thai National anthem SAA Pascal introduced the guests above.

The President then announced todays guest speaker Khun Suvit Reonroongruang, PP RC HH, who spoke about Recent Developments in Hua Hin. K Suvit began by welcoming the close working relationship existing between RCRHH & RCHH. He then talked about the recent Air Asia flight from Kuala Lumpur into HH airport. There are four flights a week on Sunday, Monday, Wednesday and Friday and he hoped these may increase to different countries.

He also paid tribute to the daily ferry operating between Khao Takiab, Hua Hin and Pattaya, cutting the journey time down to two hours. The high speed train is due in Hua Hin direct from Bangkok within the next 4-5 years, and a large family park is planned near Soi 112 and due to open in August 2018. He briefly touched on the Hua Hin Marathon,

Cha-Am Golf Festival, RCHH project to provide clean water to parts of HH and following a question advised that the fishing pier is to be turned into a fish market.

He also talked about the government plan to build an expressway from Bangkok (Doakanong) ending at the T section in Petchaburi (Wangmanoa), this project will bypass the heavy traffic in Samutsakorn where there are hundreds of factories and fish markets and speed up travel time from BKK to HH

Rtn Michael Vender raised concerns about a bypass road from Cha-am bypassing Huahin town ending in Soi 112, as this project may run through housing estates, some quite recent and will destroy local villages and infrastructure as close to home as Hin Lek Fai. K Suvit explained that he hoped concerns would be taken into account before any works go ahead.

P.Birger then presented K Suvit a certificate of appreciation from RCRHH.
