The RCoB has recently been involved with sourcing and sending equipment for paraplegic athletes at Wewak, and for loading containers of medical and school equipment for PNG.















GUEST SPEAKER — The Very Reverend Dr Peter Catt — Dean of St John's Cathedral




Dr Catt holds a Bachelor of Divinity and a PhD in Evolutionary Microbiology. He is Chair of the Australian Churches Refugee Taskforce and President of A Progressive Christian Voice. He also serves on Anglican and Ecumenical Social Justice Committees at a Diocesan and national level.

Dr Catt delivered an extremely interesting presentation on the construction and physical features of St John's Anglican Cathedral, and the many and varied ways in which the building is used as a tool for creating mutual respect and peace.



Insurance for the building is \$600,000 pa and annual running costs are \$2.5 million. Solar panels are being rented from other Anglican properties as a means to reduce the power bills.







During the equinox, the internal building structures are spectacularly illuminated.



John Loughborough Pearson was commissioned to produce sketch plans for the Cathedral in 1886. The building was completed in 3 stages starting from 1906 and finishing in 2009. The first stage was completed in 1910, the second in 1965, and the third in 2009. French stone masons were brought in to complete the work for the third stage.




The Cathedral has a bell tower and guests can visit the tower on Mondays and during the weekends.

The church has a focus on providing a secure environment for those seeking shelter.
