

These two RAWCS projects have been registered a last week to send containers of medical and educational supplies into Kenya and Goilala District PNG.

59-2023-24: Donations of Educational and Health Supplies to Goilala District PNG (RAOAF)

Working through RAWCS Northern Region RARE, 2 x 40' containers of educational and health supplies will be packed and sent to service remote communities within the Goilala District of PNG.

60-2023-24: Donations of Educational and Health Supplies to United Nationals Countryless Children Agency in Kenya (RAOAF)

Working through RAWCS Northern Region RARE, United Federation of Volunteers for Refugees Action Inc will send 40' containers of health and educational supplies to United Nationals Countryless Children Agency in Kenya (UNCC). UNCC is an Australian's Kenyan's and Ugandan's first and only non-governmental organisation working towards ending statelessness through research, advocacy and community building.



Greg joined Hear and Say in January 2022 and is committed to enriching the lives of clients through the beauty of sound.








One in six Australians is impacted by hearing loss — a figure set to rise to one in four by 2060.

One to two in every 1,000 babies in Australia is born with a permanent hearing loss, and this doubles by the time children reach school age.

Almost half of us know someone with a hearing loss.

Hear and Say is Queensland's specialised provider of audiology and speech pathology for all people with hearing loss.

Hear and Say operate state-wide and support people of all ages – from newborn babies, to toddlers, school age children and adults.







- ♦ Most of Hear and Say's work is done with children, and in particular, those requiring cochlear implants.
- Although cochlear implants can provide/restore hearing, some deaf people still wish to learn Auslan to communicate with others. An example of this was a deaf cricket team member who needed to remove cochlear implants prior to fitting a helmet, but needed to communicate with others without the implant.
- ♦ There have been changes to referral pathways; SW Queensland has stopped screening for deaf children, as they have nowhere to send the affected ones.
 - Deaf Connect has good connections with Hear and Say.









Screening

- · 14,000 children/year
- Acts as a first step towards diagnosis
- Lack of funding hurts regional families






Audiology

- There is a major gap in diagnostic testing
- No cochlear service between BNE – TVL
- Cochlear switch-ons are magical





Hearing loss and dementia*





Therapy

- Highly specialised service
- Aim is to start school with proficiency in hearing and speech
- Early intervention is key



Obstacles & Opportunities

- · Inflation v pricing power
- Referral pathways often don't exist
- Institutional barriers to progress
- Scarcity of qualified staff worldwide
- Specialisation is undervalued
- Significant needs outside the capital are a source of motivation
- The new speech pathology service is more attractive to employees
- We can improve access for people in regional locations
