Our thanks to each of the members who made their time available to ensure that the camp was a great success and particular thanks to Anthea Mollison and James Studebaker (son of Jim) who assisted the team of Rotarians.

An ongoing project initiated by P.P. John Robson is aimed at providing training to future leaders of South Africa by providing business experience in Australia. the funding of the program is to be provided from the proceeds of a gala dinner to be held in Melbourne at which President Nelson Mandella would be the Guest of Honour. This project has been delayed due to the inability of the President to commit to a timetable for an official visit to Australia.

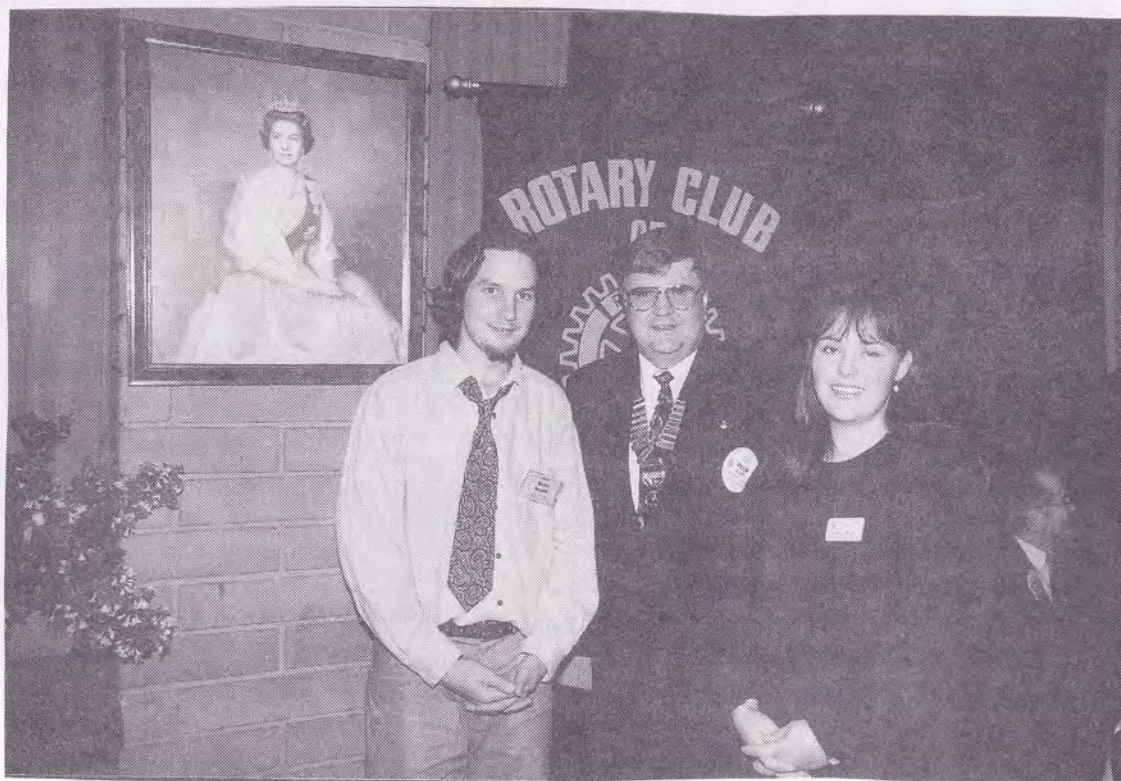

Other projects undertaken included Operation Livewire, Vocational Advice to students at Balwyn High School and the sponsorship of students to the Siemens Science School and the prestigious CRA National Summer Science Forum.

Financial support was also provided for the Chernobyl Disaster Appeal instigated by P.E. Bob Bott of the Rotary Club of St Kilda.

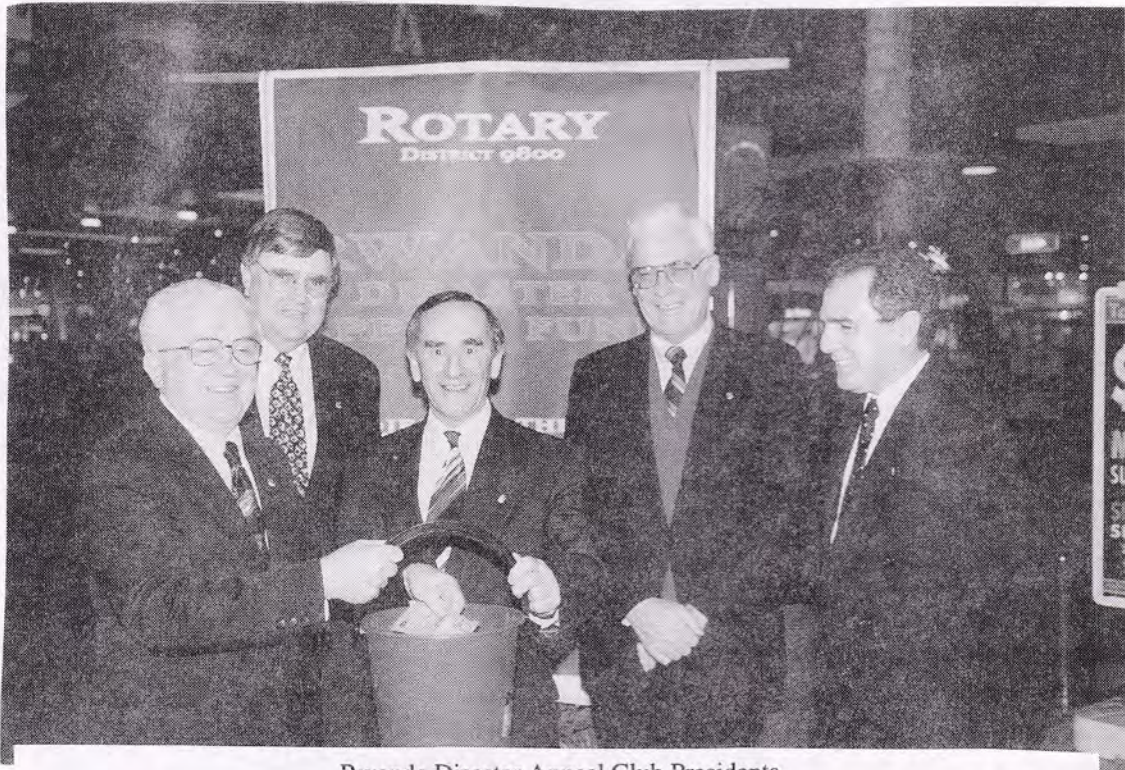

Fundraising responsibility was undertaken by P.P. Roger Benallack for which I am most grateful, as without a successful fundraising program it is not possible to undertake service projects.

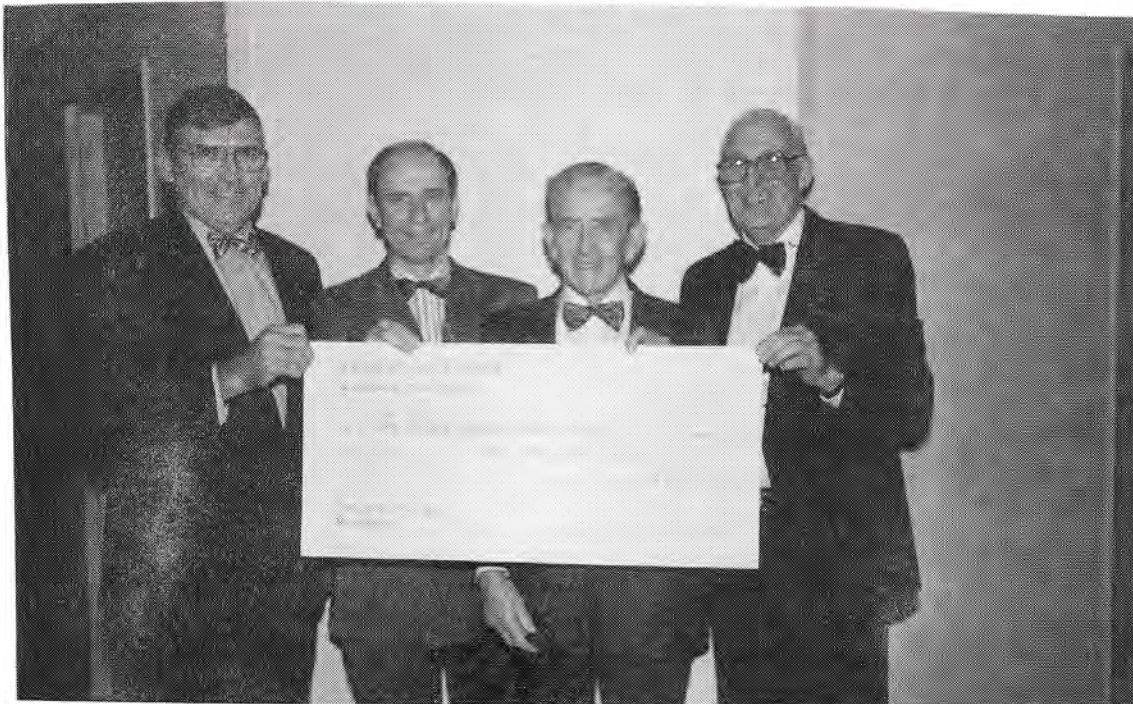

This committee meets approximately four times in the year for a formal meeting and regularly after dinner meetings as required.

The committee would like to thank Club Service and in particular Bob Ballantyne for the assistance received this year with rosters on the desk and timely advice to members of their respective duties. Our thanks also to Dick Johnson for the very efficient minute taking at Board Meetings. This was greatly appreciated.

The Treasurer & Public Officer, Geoff Dwyer and Assistant Treasurer, Ron Arthur, have transferred the Club financial records to computer, resulting in substantial savings in time and stationery costs.

During the year, Ron Arthur turned his skills to the manufacture of the banner stands, five in all, the meeting box, and a number of other innovations for our equipment store.

The Assistant Secretary, Geoff Perdriau, has maintained the attendance records for District Reports and the Board reports as required, on a weekly and monthly basis. The Club meeting sheets are now all produced on the Club Computer from our own data base.

The Club's **average attendance** to 31st May 1995, is 83.7%.

Membership has risen as of 1st July 1994 from 65 and 2 honorary = 67 members to 68 + 3 honorary to 71 as at 31st May 1995.

Our two past presidents, Ron Phillips and David Cheney completed the input of the **data base** for the computer. Ron contributed to the Club's equipment with the donation of a computer and also a slide projector. David together with Ron Carnell, has completed a reprint of the **Club by-Laws**.

While maintaining the position of official photographer for the Club, Ron Carnell continues to keep past year's club records as well as coaching a winning Quiz Team which supported the funding of Administration to the extent of \$3,050 in addition to the fellowship events which contributed \$2,064.

1. ROTARY AUSTRALIA WORLD COMMUNITY SERVICE (RAWKS)

Club to Club Interaction eg Matched Grants

Patumwan

Again we were very fortunate to have the opportunity to share a matched grant project with our sister club in Thailand, the Rotary Club of Patumwan. Our contribution of \$US2,250 enabled \$US9,000, with the assistance of Rotary International, to be spent on the provision of nine waste water treatment systems for nine rural schools in Thailand. The project is now completed and President Chaivai Poonpatmongkol reports that the children are very appreciative of the chance to learn more about water purification.

R-Birds Project - Thailand

During the year the Club contributed \$500 to the above District 9800 project. the intention is to have the District contribute \$15,000 towards the infrastructure costs of setting up industry in Thai villages to keep rural families together. An area in North-East Thailand has been selected and a Bangkok garment and knitting company has put in place a garment making factory and the villagers are being taught how to sew the pre-cut segments. A vegetable farming project is also going ahead.

DIK (Donations in Kind)

Samarinda General Hospital, East Kalimantan, Indonesia.

A project undertaken in conjunction with RC of Port Phillip Melbourne to properly equip the hospital's surgical ward.

There has been an excellent response to the appeal (\$100,000 of equipment) and the current intention is to ship in late June 1995.

Both D.G.E. John Reddish and P.P. John Meehan have visited the Samarinda hospital during the year to determine urgent needs.

Chernobyl

A project instigated by Mr Bob Bott to alleviate the sufferings of some of the thousands of victims of this nuclear disaster. One aspect of the project is to move medical equipment from Peter Macallum Clinic to Minsk in the Ukraine. Bob is seeking a special matching grant from RI for this operation. He has already obtained \$50,000 from a German Rotary District to match with \$50,000 previously raised in District 9800. Our club contributed \$2,000 to the appeal.

2. FOUNDATION

International Educational and Cultural Exchange Activities

Group Study Exchange

We were delighted that P.P. John Reddish was awarded the honour of leading the District 9800 GSE Team to Bangladesh. The tour was a great success and our club hosted the official welcome home. All the Camberwell areas clubs were in attendance. We are presently considering a request from the Rotary Club of Dhaka Cosmopolitan in Bangladesh to work together as a sister club.

3. MODEL UNITED NATIONALS ASSEMBLY (MUNA)

The club sponsored two year 11 students from Balwyn High School to take part in the MUNA weekend (UN debate) which was held on 24-25 May, 1995. Each participant in the debate took the role of a representative (Turkey for our reps) of a particular country and had the responsibility of learning as much as possible about that country prior to the debate - a very worthwhile activity which was most successful.

4. INTERNATIONAL TOASTS TO OTHER CLUBS

This new segment commenced early in the year with a talk on RC of Patumwan. This was followed up with several more toasts to clubs familiar to one or other of our members. the following weeks Bulletins were then signed by members and sent to the respective clubs.

1994-95 saw one of the busiest and most productive years in the history of the Youth Service Committee.

A brief overview of activities and initiatives of our committee would have to include:-

1. The hosting of the 21-23 October RYPEN Camp.
2. The initiation and advancement of a scheme to assist the new South Africa.
3. The care and counselling of a visiting Rotary exchangee.
4. The counselling of two outgoing exchangees.
5. The sponsoring of four students to RYPEN camps.
6. The sponsoring of two youth leaders to the RYLA camp.
7. The selection of a student to participate in the 1996 Youth Exchange program.
8. The selection of two other students to be sponsored by interested clubs.
9. The selection of host families for our incoming student, Camilla Hansen.
10. The continued assistance to our Rotaract Club, whose membership has grown remarkably in the past year.

Three items from the above deserve special comment.

RYPEN

This year our club was selected to be host club for the RYPEN (Rotary Program of Enrichment) camp at Weekaway Camp at Lancefield from 21-23 October.

We were to provide physical needs such as food and cleaning of facilities and also medical facilities which were provided by our own Dr John Reddish for 57 students from Year 10 in colleges throughout our District, 14 Rotaractors (who acted as leaders and counsellors) and from 5 to 13 Rotarians and family.

The preparation, cooking and serving of 10 meals (including a three-course extravaganza at a sample Rotary Dinner) was a major task. Extraordinary preparation and planning were carried out prior to the event, which resulted in an amazingly well-run camp. Particular mention should be made of Rotarian John McBride, who detailed records of supplies used, meals cooked, staff required, cost of every item etc, have already been used by the last host club, and I am sure, will be used by all future clubs.

Washing up and drying all dishes and cooking utensils by hand provided entertainment and fellowship for many hours of each day and the forum for much discussion of world and Rotary affairs.

Mention should also be made of our Rotaract Club from whom the majority of counsellors and the Leader (Anne-Marie heath) were chosen.

South African Project

Our Committee offered their support (and obtained that of the Board) for a project initiated by one of our committee, John Robson.

The idea of the project was to invite President Mandela to speak at a specially arranged gala night, at which funds would be obtained to assist in the training of three young people over three years to prepare them for leadership roles in the future administration of South Africa.

This program was seen by our District Governor as worthy of the backing of our District. John has been in touch with many people, including past Prime Ministers, Ambassadors, High Commissioner and other influential people.

The Project is presently on "hold" as we wait for information on a possible visit by President Mandela.

Youth Exchange

Youth Exchange is of course a well established project of our Club and we have been very fortunate in our Exchangees, both outgoing and incoming - the last of which was the unforgettable Mika Makita!!

However, I though the Club would be interested in the results of our recent selection process for 1996 exchange.

Over three nights, our selection committee of Anthony Stokes, Ian Richardson and myself interviewed ten candidates for one sponsorship from our Club. The students were of such a high standard that we decided to send our selection - Elinor McGuire (University High) as well as two others - Marcus Cumming (McLeod Tech) and Fiona Newman (Genazzano) on to District selection in the hope that other clubs would take up the extra two. Amazingly, the three students were selected to go on exchange, with Port Phillip Melbourne and Hawthorn clubs taking up Marcus and Fiona. This is an outstanding achievement by our club.
