### FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

When I was nominated as President three years ago little did I know what I was in for! I have learned much more about Rotary and it has been a rewarding, exciting and at times challenging experience. This is a wonderful Club with many varied activities and ongoing projects.

One of the privileges of being President is having the opportunity to speak personally with our guest speakers, almost all of whom commented about the buzz at dinner meetings and that the Club is as vibrant as demonstrated by the reports of Directors. These reports are an indication of the real involvement by so many members in club activities. The Rotary International President for this year chose as the slogan for the year "Rotary Shares" which this Club has fully embraced. This was typified at our 28th Birthday Night when almost \$12,000 was donated by members to assist the people of Burma!

Some of the goals I set as incoming President were to have activities and projects with a focus on raising awareness within the local community of our Club and Rotary with an emphasis on membership. In consultation with incoming Board members and President Elect Bill Oakley other goals were: (a) the introduction of more transparent decision making arrangements, (b) ensuring that each committee comprised experienced members as well as new members, and (c) directors nominating a deputy.

The Club has been well served by the directors and chairmen of committees who have given so much of their time, talent and energy in the interest of "Rotary Shares".

The Club Service and Administration Committee under the capable chairmanship of lan Taylor has been a strong force in many key aspects of the Club's life, ensuring completion of the requisite financial and administrative accountabilities; that there was an increase in membership; marked improvement in public relations and marketing; and the provision of excellent opportunities for fellowship. Thank you lan and your team for your unstinting efforts. Geoff Haddy, in his first term as Treasurer, has worked assiduously to improve our accounting systems and to ensure transparency in financial reporting and record keeping. Secretary Brian Hurnard has carried a very heavy load, shared by Assistant Secretary Mike McKay, as he has prepared for his new role as District Secretary. I owe much to Brian for his wise counsel and support on so many matters. Sergeant Ted Wilkins has grown enormously in this demanding role with responsibility for running each meeting. He has managed to take almost \$2000 in fines while entertaining us. Graeme Bird, the Editor of Grapevine, another demanding weekly task, has also reviewed and upgraded this weekly club bulletin. Radio Don continues to be ably presented each month on 96.5 Inner FM by Don Bowden, John Mollison and Tony Wells.

Garth Symington has chaired the International Service Committee with its highly successful "Adopt a Community" program in Tulagi in the Solomon Islands which this year gained a second Matching Grant from the Rotary Foundation. This program has attracted support from international and Australian Rotary Clubs. The success of the program, in its fourth year, is due largely to the selfless contribution of members who have traveled to Tulagi at their own expense. It was a fine example of Rotary sharing when Joseph Aarons, a teacher of agriculture in the Solomon Islands came to Australia as the recipient of the Royce and Jean Abbey Agricultural Scholarship. This activity would not have been so successful without the support of Bob and Carmel Bott to whom we are grateful. Through Bob Adams, support was provided for two young girls who were brought to Australia for corrective surgery under Rotary's ROMAC program. In support of the Rotary Foundation 16 members signed on as Centurions and Carmel Bott was recognised as a Paul Harris Fellow on our Birthday Night for her support over the years for community-based charities and to Rotary. At Changeover three more members will be similarly recognised and two other awards will be announced.

The New Generations Committee, under the enthusiastic leadership of Bronwen Dimond, has supported young people to benefit from most of Rotary's youth leadership and development programs. The high calibre of the young people selected was demonstrated when they reported to the Club so impressively throughout the year. Line Boldsen Madsen, our Danish exchange student, has been a delight and she has represented her country well. Her stay has been a happy one thanks to the welcome she has received from her host families and her counselor, George Swanson. Bronwen and Matthew Pauli have provided outstanding support and guidance to our Rotaract Club which is gaining in strength as a result. I thank the Rotaractors for their support for the Club in a number of our activities. We are also lucky to have such a vibrant Interact Club at Balwyn High School. I congratulate and thank Interactors for their generous funding support for the Club.

An impressive level of support for the local and wider community was provided by Ken Maxfield's Community Service Committee. With assistance from many members and their partners the Salvation Army collection beat last year's record; we continued to donate food items for distribution for Camcare and to help maintain Jack Nankervis House. Last winter Peter Cleary readily established a team of volunteers who worked over several weeks in support of people in Gippsland whose lives were in turmoil after the devastating floods. Bruce Timbs has represented the Club on the Boroondara Cares Committee that is working with the Shire of Moira to provide assistance to families experiencing deprivation from the ongoing drought. Our Club also has responsibility for a school-to-school project in the Shire.

Activity of the Vocational Service Committee has increased under the chairmanship of Matthew Pauli. Highlights of this committee's activities include two interesting and educative vocational visits. At Lilydale College of TAFE we sampled the culinary skills of the international hospitality students at dinner while at Odyssey House we were impressed by the residents who acted as guides on an informative tour of the property.

Elisabeth Hall as Fundraising Director has received considerable support from across the Club as many activities that raise funds can be classified as community or fellowship activities. As the results of our fundraising are summarised in the Treasurer's report, I will only refer to the highlights and thank all concerned in making them so successful. There is no doubt that the Rotary River Ride is a great community activity and this year, despite inclement weather conditions, it did very well. Terry Keyhoe's entrepreneurial skills came to the fore when we started the successful community café in Macleay Park during the cricket season. The Charity Golf Day with so many sponsors was another great success, as was the Trivia Night held at the Hawthorn Town Hall. Our catering engagements, including the Grand Prix, are excellent opportunities not only for fundraising but for good fellowship.

My thanks go to Paul Fitz and the Horizons Committee for their major contribution in leading the discussion and planning regarding developments in membership, public relations and marketing, the role of committees, and leadership planning for the Club into the future. Thanks are also due to Gregor Matthews for his work with the Projects Committee in addition to his enormous responsibility in leading the organisation of next year's District Conference in Launceston.

I sincerely thank those members who are serving as chairmen or members of many District committees who personify the ideal of "Service above self". Not the least of these members is Assistant Governor Jim Studebaker who, on 29 June, will be inducted as District Governor of District 9800. Jim will be the third member of this Club to serve as District Governor, following in the footsteps of Past District Governors Greg Ross and John Reddish. We congratulate Jim and wish him a successful and fulfilling year.

It was with great regret that the Board received the letter of retirement from the Club and from Rotary from John Reddish because of ill health. In recognition of John's outstanding contribution to this Club and at the highest levels of Rotary over an extended period it was unanimously agreed to make him an honorary member. We trust he will enjoy a return to full health and hopefully rejoin us in the future.

My sincere thanks go to Ann Kerr who, as my Vice President, has been most supportive especially when I was unable to be present and was always ready to take on additional tasks. To Bill and his Board I wish you a successful Conference year and offer my wholehearted support.

I extend to Alison my special thanks for her unstinting support and encouragement to me and for the activities she has organised for partners.

### Upgrade of Website

The first stage of this upgrade focused on graphics overhaul and the introduction of easier site useability for Members. Web Master Dick Johnson has successfully achieved both these criteria and graphically presented the changes to members at our 24 April meeting. The introduction of new photo banners and multiple "click-ons" offering easier site negotiation are refreshing advancements.

The ongoing second stage of the upgrade, will focus on the introduction of new, feasible technological developments and enhancements suitable to meet the Club's future requirements.

### Upgrade and review of Grapevine

The Grapevine has been upgraded with "clean-up" changes to the symmetry of the graphics. The content has shown a stronger focus on Rotary matters derived from: "An Introduction to Programs Of Rotary". At our August 2007 meeting Graeme Bird and Mike McKay surveyed Members about the Grapevine which provided some constructive suggestions. It was generally considered that regular editions of 15-16 pages were too large and hence most editions have been smaller and emailed to Members on a very timely basis, Sunday night or Monday. The production of a Grapevine every week is a very substantial task; Graeme Bird has been a very good Editor, Thank you Graeme, well done.

### The development of media contacts and coverage of community activities

Don Bowden and Don Taylor have established a very professional rapport with the Editor of the Progress Leader that has resulted in the publication of many community activities initiated by the Club. All Directors now have the opportunity to provide Don with written material regarding their community activities that would be prepared for release to media targets. TV and Radio exposure was received when our Guest speaker was Simon Overland, Deputy Commissioner of Police.

In September 2007 the Club became a Member of Australia Associated Press that provides the professional facility to release Rotary media statements to specific targets across all media sections. In February 2008, a DVD of TV news items generated by the Club was sent to the Public Relations Department of Rotary International, Evanston for their information.

### Review of present brochures

The Membership Committee has produced an excellent new brochure directed at the recruitment of new members which will be distributed at Club functions involving the attendance of non members.

Don Bowden, Tony Wells and John Mollison continue the Rotary hour on Radio 96.5FM, it's now 12 years since inception. Don and Tony provide the anchor roles with comments and music and John interviews excellent guests on a variety of Rotary subjects. The listening audience is unknown but the program promotes the ideals and activities of Rotary.

### Program/Speakers

John Gartlan and John Robson are to be congratulated; they have presented the Club with a wide variety of excellent speakers. Speakers have been interesting, educational, controversial and our Club member's autobiographies excellent. All speaker details are listed later in this report.

It has been a very busy year with our principle focus again being the continuation of the key projects in our five year "Adopt a Community" program on Tulagi in the Solomon Islands. We have very successfully hosted a teacher from the Solomon Islands on an Ambassadorial Scholarship, along with hands on participation in D9800's ROMAC program and we have had a group assist at the district DIK facility in West Footscray.

The "Adopt a Community" program is a needs based program directed towards assisting the development and welfare of the Tulagi community, and hopefully helping them to help themselves. The project is registered with RAWCS and is primarily focused on health and education. It also has synergies with Rotarians Against Malaria (RAM), Save Water Save Lives (SWSL) and Donations In Kind (DIK). The Rotary Foundation is a critical source of funding through Matching Grants.

In March 2008 we gained approval for a second Matching Grant from the Rotary Foundation for US\$46,650. This has been achieved by a truly international effort, with five clubs from the Mississippi District in the USA, plus D2420 from Turkey (via the RC of Goksu) again contributing, along with the RC of Werribee and our own D9800. This will enable the installation of six water tanks, an emergency generator, security fencing and bed nets for the Tulagi Hospital. The water tanks and generator are being purchased and installed by Honiara contractors, and whilst the fencing materials are being purchased in Honiara, a team of ten Rotary Volunteers, six from the RC of Port Lincoln (SA) and four from our Club, are going over for two weeks in July to erect the fence and complete other maintenance jobs at the hospital.

We have also arranged for a team from the RC of Werribee, who have been very supportive of this community project, to go to Tulagi in September to construct a Technical / Carpentry workshop at the McMahon School to enable students to learn trades which can be used in ongoing community projects. Funds are already in place for this project, which will use local timber and labour.

The most visible project to North Balwyn members, and a highlight, was the awarding of the Royce and Jean Abbey Agricultural Scholarship to Joseph Aarons, teacher from the Don Bosco Rural Farm at Tetere in the Solomon Islands. Joseph spent three months in Australia studying rice growing and animal husbandry mainly in the Riverina area of NSW. We had fantastic support from Rotarians and Rotary Clubs in the Leeton /Riverina Region, and Joseph, who had never been out of the Solomon's, spoke at a number of Clubs, learnt an enormous amount, and was a outstanding ambassador for his country. A very big thank you to Bob and Carmel Bott who organised this project and were his 'family' during his stay. This type of international project which trains people to train others in their own country is very worthwhile.

Our Club through Bob Adam's participation in the District ROMAC Committee hosted two 12 year old girls for Nauru who had open heart surgery at the Melbourne Children's Hospital. They were in Melbourne for a period of 4-5 weeks and whilst living independently were looked after by Club members and attended two Club meetings. They are both back in Nauru and fit and healthy again.

The International Service Committee has had terrific support from fundraising activities by both the North Balwyn Rotaract and Interact Clubs. Thank you again.

### The Rotary Foundation - funds Rotary projects around the world

In April 2003, The Rotary Foundation embarked on a new marketing venture to encourage every Rotarian to participate in our Rotary Foundation every year. In Australia, the program was named 'The Centurion Program' and encourages members to donate a minimum \$100 every year. Since the program began in 2003, global donations reached US\$102 million by 2007. North Balwyn has 22 Centurions – 25% of the club membership.

During the year, other donations to The Rotary Foundation included Paul Harris Fellow Recognitions of which there were three and one Sapphire – each contributing US\$1,000 to the Foundation. One member joined the Benefactor Recognition Program. A benefactor is a person who informs the Foundation in writing that he/she has made a provision in his or her will or other estate plan, naming the Foundation's Permanent Fund as a beneficiary.

It is our usual custom to invite an Ambassadorial Scholar to speak at one of our November meetings. Although there were only four scholars studying at Victorian Universities this year, we were delighted to have Michael Januszewicz from the USA as our speaker. ### THE ROYCE ABBEY AWARDS PROGRAM


This program is to recognise members in their early years in Rotary who show enthusiasm and commitment to the ideals of Rotary.

### **FINANCES**

The finances of this Club have been carefully managed by the Board and reflect the hard work and generosity of all members. The presentation of results for the first eleven months of the year are shown on the following pages in a new format we hope will be clear and informative. Your feedback will be welcome.

The Club operates two main sets of accounts

- ADMINISTRATION accounts contain all the transactions relating to the day-to-day operations of the Club including our financial obligations to Rotary International and to District 9800. We have two ADMIN bank accounts: a cheque account and an investment account.
- SERVICE accounts contain all the transactions relating to our fundraising and other
  monies received to carry out our services, projects and donations for the benefit of our
  local and international community, including our contributions to the Rotary Foundation.
  Again, there are two bank accounts: a cheque account and an investment account.

Both sets of accounts demonstrate that the Club has enjoyed a very busy and successful year and that, in financial terms, we have carefully managed our expenses, and achieved excellent results in our SERVICE work.

As this report only contains figures for eleven months of the financial year, a full set of the year's accounts will be prepared after 30 June, audited and presented to members.

There are other financial activities in which the Club is involved which are not reported here.


- A US Dollar account has been established for the purpose of receiving and managing the second Matching Grant for Tulagi.

### **ADMINISTRATION ACCOUNT FOR 11 MONTHS TO 31 May 2008**


### **NET ASSETS AT START OF YEAR**


