President Stan's Summary

After an "Interest" meeting on 10 April 1980 and an "Organisational" meeting on 24 April the Provisional Rotary Club of North Balwyn was admitted to Rotary International on 8 May 1980.

On 29 May 1980 was our most memorable Charter Presentation night at the Camberwell Civic Centre when DG Jack Nankervis presented the Club Charter to Charter President Stan Hibbert in the presence of members and guests including the Mayor and Mayoress of Camberwell. The District Governor's Special Representative, P.P. Duncan McKenzie supervised proceedings with, we believe, some degree of satisfaction.

Our first full year began on 1 July 1980 and all members, with the exception of the Executive, were allocated to one or more Committees.

The 1980-year commenced with 31 members and during the year five members were inducted and one resigned leaving a net membership of 35 on 30 June 1981. Members inducted in the first year were John Reddish, Roger Horton, Trevor Friend, Frank Fricke and George King.

The Board accepted with regret the resignation of Vocational Director Jim Burkhalter. Following his resignation Helmut Scheiber led the Vocational committee.

Ken Proposch and his Program team organised a well balanced year of programs which included 24 guest speakers. Almost all of the members presented their autobiographies and two members gave job talks.

Four combined meetings were held with other clubs and a meeting was held at a large engineering works.

David Stockman, Fellowship Director, got us off to a fine start when prior to Charter Bev and Stan Hibbert opened their home enabling our ladies to meet, many for the first time.

That very pleasant meeting was followed shortly by an evening at Argenti's Receptions.

Our 'Changeover" night, also at Argenti's, culminated a very happy Club social year. The range of activities laid the foundations for the excellent spirit of friendship being experienced in such a short time.

The Vocational Committee organised autobiographies, job talks and, together with the Youth Committee, provided careers talks to children approaching school leaving age. These activities also provided members with an understanding of one another's jobs.

International Director Graham Foard and his committee's first aim was to make us a 100% Rotary Foundation Club. The very successful Art Auction was the highlight of their year.

Patrick Culshaw, as Youth Director, with the assistance of Ron Carnell quickly established a relationship with Greythorn HS and ran an essay competition for the students. (This competition subsequently became the Vern. McConnchie Awards).

Fred Pike and his hard working Community Service Committee organised the sale of wine, shirts and plum puddings as fund raising activities and established our Christmas Stocking raffle. The Senior Citizens' Centre benefited from the success of these activities by way of cutlery, crockery and blackout curtains.

Each member of the Club during its charter year "Took Time to Serve" and we certainly achieved the first object of Rotary – "Development of Acquaintance as an Opportunity for SERVICE".

The Rotary year of 1980-81 had been a year of challenge for our Club in its Charter Year. As President, I have been thrilled with the acceptance of this challenge by all members. The Club has performed its Rotary tasks with enthusiasm and success.

I believe our most significant success has been fellowship. We are no longer just members; we are friends on a family basis and this augers well for our future in Rotary.

This year for me, and for Bev, has been one of stimulation and learning and I take the opportunity to thank all members and their families for their assistance and fellowship during the year.

I also thank most sincerely PDG Jack Nankervis and P.P. Duncan McKenzie for their friendship, guidance, tolerance and commitment

The plan was well received and related activities continued for many years; regrettably the Council failed to meet its initial commitments!

Fund raising was limited but we did raise \$600 from an art auction and \$1,856 from two stalls at Camberwell's May festival.

We were saddened by the death of Charter Member Vern McConchie on 21/08/81. Our Greythorn HS Essay Competition was renamed the Vern McConchie Award in his memory.

This year will be remembered as the "Polio Plus" year, in which every Rotary Club undertook the task of fulfilling a commitment to raise sufficient funds to immunise the children of the world against Polio and other vaccine-preventable diseases.

Our Club achieved its target of \$10,440 and was one of twenty-two clubs in our District to receive a 100% banner in recognition. The club embarked on a hole-in-one competition as the principal fund raising event for the year.

With the guidance of Fund-Raising Chairman David Cheney, \$16,787 was raised and this became the most profitable venture undertaken in the eight-year history of the Club. The project will also be remembered for the fellowship enjoyed and the hands-on approach that we revel in. With this money, together with that raised from other activities, over \$30,000 was dispensed to various charities and organisations.

Our involvement in all facets of Rotary Service, confirms that we practiced the theme - "United in Service - Dedicated to Peace".

The Club hosted a GSE team, hosted two in-bound and sponsored two out-bound Exchange Students, participated in the RYLA Seminar, subsidised a student to attend the Science Summer School in Canberra and continued the development of the R.I. Youth Art Exchange project. Our involvement with the Rotaract Club has ensured its growth and stability.

During this year the President's Award was introduced, the winner of which should be the Rotarian who, the President alone considers has made an outstanding contribution to the Club during that year. It is not surprising that the first award was made to Ron Carnell.

President Peter's Summary

Rotary International was fortunate to have such a truly inspirational leader as President Bhichai. His wonderful theme was truly memorable, not only for its beauty but also for its various humorous interpretations during the year!

The year saw the completion and handing over of the Jack Nankervis House for homeless youth. Apart from the keys, which were handed over to Anglicare at a December dinner meeting, we also handed over a cheque for \$45,000 to complete our commitment to the project and provided another \$1,909 in "white" and other goods.

All board members were challenged to introduce at least one new project or program for the year. This challenge they took up with gusto, and, as a result, were born "sounding board" (to provide advice and support for small business people); a RAWCS project to refurbish a hospital in Vanuatu destroyed by a hurricane; a plan to develop a community centre in north Balwyn Village to celebrate RI's Centenary in 2005' a major family bike ride; a community computer centre and the hosting of country children from drought stricken areas.

2002-3 also saw the rewriting of our club by-laws by PP David Cheney and his committee. This was not deemed satisfactory by the dogmatic and pedantic committee, and was not presented to the club for approval until ten drafts had been written.

Special mention should be made of the outstanding contribution of our members towards the eradication of polio worldwide. We set a target of \$125 per member as well as \$115 per member for Foundation commitments. In total, we set a target of \$240 per member – a total of \$20,400. The incentive of matching contributions by RI, Government, the World Bank and the Gates foundation saw us able to more than fulfill our commitment. This was an achievement that I believe will stand as a record for our club for many years.

This was done with help from our Burke Cluster Group and proceeds from a concert, together with some help from DG Don Jago. The incubator was dedicated to Paul Moran an Australian television journalist who was the first Australian killed in Iraq and bears a Rotary plaque in English and Arabic with his name.

Rotary celebrated its 100th Anniversary during this Rotary year. Priorities for our club were to further increase our strong membership base, engage in a significant community service activity, engage in a significant international service project and enjoy the year.

And while doing all this, we had fun – occasions such as The Greek Olympic Night, the District Conference in Hobart and our 25th Club Birthday Party at the Manningham Club featuring virtuoso pianist Alan Kogosowski, with 169 members, partners and guests attending.

President Tony's Summary

The Club's 30th year of existence provided an opportunity for consolidation and development, underpinned by a revised administrative structure based on Rotary's Club Leadership Plan.

Work began on developing a strategic plan for the Club, including a facilitated planning session in which members of the Club participated.

The Club hosted the inbound GSE team from Spain, while South America was the focus of Rotary Youth Exchange, with the arrival of Cecy Silveira Perez do Nascimento from Brazil and the return of Olivia Bassini after a successful year, also in Brazil.

The Club hosted the D9800 RYPEN camp at Lancefield in March.

Fellowship remained a key element in Club life and this year's Committee developed an excellent and varied program for members.

A trend towards declining membership was noted and addressed by the Membership Committee with the development of innovative programs to attract new members.

Fundraising also remained a key issue with various options under review. The Club conducted extensive due diligence on a proposal to develop and operate an Op Shop style of retail outlet to raise funds to support service programs .
