Camberwell built a pagoda over the back verandah and Balwyn has provided some important funding.

ter than last year's event. Planning for the Christmas raffle is also well underway.


Our major recipient of fund-raising this year will be mental health research and treatment. This links with major problems being experienced in our community such as family violence, drug abuse, homelessness and suicide.





The 1945 "Bloodbath" Grand Final, played between South Melbourne and Carlton, is described as the most violent Grand Final in VFL/AFL history.

About five years ago, when lan wrote a long article on the Bloodbath, he spoke to 11 of those who played in it - four from South, seven from Carlton. One of the Carlton players, Jim Clark, who had desperately wanted to go to the war and been prevented by his family, told lan with pride how a returned soldier in the crowd had told him the match embodied the spirit of Australians at war.

lan had always assumed that the Blood-bath was a case of young men home from war letting loose their demons on a foot-ball field. In fact, only two of those who played, South's Laurie Nash and Carlton's Clinton Wines, had seen active service. What happened was that young men who hadn't been to war played a war game in front of a lot of young men who had. The match, played at Carlton because the MCG was still in use as a military base, drew a crowd of 60,000.

Why Rotarians can expect to live longer

According to a <u>recent ABS study</u>, Australia is one of just six countries where both men and women can expect to live until they're 80.



The reason why is that the idea of retirement has changed. The old ideas of slowing down and quiet afternoon teas have been replaced by a change in attitude. People who have been making decisions all their working lives are not going to switch off – they just focus on different things.

For many it's a time to see the world again. For others, it's a time to take up projects that were not possible because of time re-

straints during a 40 plus years working career.

The chance to give back something to the community is an opportunity more Australians are taking as they get older. The importance of volunteering was highlighted in the recent 2016 census:

Question 51 in the Census, which asks "In the *last twelve months* did the person spend any time doing voluntary work through an organisation or group?".

A Wisconsin USA Longitudinal Study, which has followed a random sample of 10,317 Wisconsin residents from their high school graduation in 1957 until the present, reported how often the participants had volunteered within the past 10 years.

Some of the participants' motives were <u>more oriented towards others</u> such as "I feel it is important to help others" or "volunteering is an important activity to the people I know best". Other respondents, however, had more self-oriented reasons for volunteering, such as "volunteering is a good escape from my own troubles" or "volunteering makes me feel better about myself".

Researchers then compared the participants' responses with physical health information that had mostly been collected in 1992. The researchers also considered the respondents' socioeconomic status, mental health, social support, marital status and health risk factors, including smoking, body mass index and alcohol use.

The findings showed that those who volunteered for more <u>altruistic reasons</u> had lower mortality rates as of 2008 than people who did not volunteer. Of the 2,384 non-volunteers and those who volunteered for self-oriented reasons, 4.3 percent were deceased four years later, compared with 1.6 percent of altruistic volunteers who were deceased.


