





Geoff's Health Tip Should you be concerned about a Mosquito bite?



I was surprised to learn that mosquitoes kill more people each year than all other animals combined. The World Health Organisation (WHO) estimated there were 725,000 deaths in 2015, the result of an infection carried by mosquitoes, of which 600,000 are Malaria victims. Next in order, the WHO estimated were 50,000 deaths resulting from snake bites, 1,000 from crocodiles, 500 from rhinos, 100 from lions, and 10 from sharks.

In Victoria, there are three significant mosquito-borne diseases: Ross River Virus, Barmah Forest Virus disease and Australian Arbo-encephalitis.

Professor Charles Guest, Victoria's Chief Health Officer, said "314 people had been detected with Ross River Virus during calendar year 2016, a 50% jump from the previous year." The Barmah Forest disease is similar to the Ross River Virus disease, and occurs in the same areas along the Murray River from Mildura to Echuca. These diseases can be debilitating, but not fatal. Australian Arboencephalitis also occurs in Northern Victoria, and this disease can be fatal. Professor Guest said, "whilst these infections are rare in Melbourne, people were at risk in all parts of the state".

The early symptoms of these infections usually include fatigue, headache and feeling unwell. The symptoms may occur from two to twenty days after infection, however in the case of <u>Arboencephalitis</u> there is a sudden onset of fever and frontal headache.

When most of us see or hear a mosquito in our vicinity we dispatch it in the usual way, but there are occasions when you realise you have been bitten only once the sting is felt. With Climate Change, warmer weather is heading further south bringing the conditions under which these diseases survive. Just be aware, nothing may happen, but if you get the above symptoms, remember approximately when you were bitten by a mosquito and seek medical attention.
