Guest Speaker: Ms. Tammy Shepherd; Heal Africa - The Congo



Zambia

Tammy once went camping in Werribee on their Slumber Safari experience and commented to her husband that this was as close as she would ever get to being in Africa. However now Tammy travels to Goma, DRCongo with a team from WorldShare, to work at Heal Africa at their request on a mission to improving health, empower women, and promote education. HEAL Africa is based in Goma. the eastern region of DRC, near the border of Rwanda. Activities focus on the areas of Maniema. North Kivu. and South Kivu.

It's a Country in a lot of need due to tribal conflict following indeso pendence from Belgium in 1960.

There are now 2.6 million people displaced in Congo, over 30 different armed groups, and thousands of killings and rapes each year. The UN has deployed one of its largest peacekeeping missions there, and half a dozen processes and agreepeace ments have failed to bring an

end to the fighting. However countries provide several billion dollars in aid to Congo every year, and along with 21,000 peacekeepers and NGOs there is hope for a peaceful future.

Volunteers to Heal Africa preferably have specialized skills and speak French or Swahili and can stay for extended periods. Tammv is a physiotherapist and is learning Swahili and plans to give a speech on her next tour. Read more HERE



Geoff's Health Tip

Obesity - a National disaster in the making

A study published in the Lancet on April 1 is no April Fools Day joke! The study put a number on our nations' girth, with serious implications for cancer rates, the food industry and ageing populations. For a long time experts were not sure of Australia's obesity rate, but empirical proof now shows that 27% of Australians are obese*. The percentage has doubled since 1975, and at the present rate, 40% of Australians will be obese by 2025. Research indicates that one in four Australians now have an increased risk of cancer, cardiovascular-disease, diabetes and stroke - a cocktail that will bankrupt an already overwhelmed healthcare system.

Professor Bruce Neal, director of the food policy Division of the George Institute in Sydney said, "Driving the rapid increase in obesity is the changing food environment. We now have incredibly cheap, incredibly unhealthy food available everywhere. In that environment, people will become obese."

How can we provide the incentive to reduce or even eliminate the consumption of junk food? I believe we have, as a nation, led the world in reducing tobacco consumption. Can we lead the world in driving obesity down? As the Government ultimately controls what is acceptable behavior for all citizens as well as corporations, the rising obesity rate should be sufficient impetus for our Government to impose a tax on sugared drinks in much the same way as the duty levied on tobacco.

Health Victoria is the chief financial source of funding 'Quit Smoking' in Victoria. In addition to taxing sugary drinks, Health Victoria should now turn their attention to funding a 'Only Eat Healthy Food' campaign to avert what appears to be a public health disaster in the making.

* Obesity as measured by BMI (Body Mass Index) = Weight in kg divided by

height in meters x height in meters

A person weighing 71 kg who has a height of 1.75 meter has a BMI of 23.2.

A person with a BMI less than 25 is considered healthy. A person with a BMI of more than 30 is considered obese.


